22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23

24 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
25 Assessment Coordination Department for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following
26 maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the
27 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code
28 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.
29 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual
30 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of
31 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying
32 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the
33 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),
34 or its successor.

22 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Assessment
 23 Coordination Department for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum
 24 number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help",
 25 payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: three (3)
 26 temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed
 27 those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its
 28 successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

30 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 31 to the Assessment Coordination Department, to be payable from the
 32 Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account, for personal services and operating
 33 expenses of the Assessment Coordination Department for the biennial period
 34 ending June 30, 2007, the following:

There is hereby appropriated, to the Assessment Coordination Department, to be payable from the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund, for paying counties and professional reappraisal companies for the cost of reappraisal of real property for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND TRANSFER. To provide funding for the appropriations authorized herein, the Director of the Assessment Coordination Department of the State of Arkansas shall certify monthly to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the amount of funding needed each month to pay counties and professional reappraisal companies for the reappraisal of real property as required by law. Upon receipt of such certification the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer 76% of the amounts certified from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account, 16% of the amount certified from the County Aid Fund, and 8% of the amount certified from the Municipal Aid Fund to the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund. In no event shall the total amount of funds transferred as authorized herein exceed fourteen million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$14,250,000) during each year of the ~~2003-05~~ 2005-07 biennium.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
 2 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

 4 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Amend Arkansas Code 19-5-906 regarding the
 5 Ad Valorem Tax Fund to read as follows:

6
 7 (a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor of
 8 State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a trust fund to be known as
 9 the Ad Valorem Tax Fund. This fund shall consist of those trust revenues
 10 derived from the ad valorem taxes as authorized by §§ 26-26-1614 - 26-26-
 11 1616, and 26-26-1701 - 26-26-1707. It shall be used to reimburse the
 12 Constitutional Officers Fund and State Central Services Fund on account of
 13 expenditures made to the Local Audit Division of the Legislative Audit
 14 Division of the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee and to the appropriate
 15 fund or fund account from which the Tax Division of the Arkansas Public
 16 Service Commission and the Assessment Coordination ~~Division~~ Department ~~of the~~
 17 ~~Arkansas Public Service Commission~~ derive their support, there to be used to
 18 reimburse such fund or fund account for expenditures made by ~~these~~ the
 19 divisions and the department each fiscal year.

20 (b) All ad valorem tax monies transferred to the appropriate fund or fund
 21 account from which the Assessment Coordination Department derives its support
 22 as required by subsection (a) of this section remaining at the end of a
 23 fiscal year shall remain in the fund or fund account and shall be carried
 24 forward and made available to the department in the following fiscal year.

25 ~~(b)~~ (c) In the event there are insufficient moneys available in the Ad
 26 Valorem Tax Fund to fully reimburse such fund or fund account, the Chief
 27 Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer to each fund an amount based upon
 28 what the percentage of the expenditures of each fund or fund account bears to
 29 the total of all expenditures for the divisions and to the department in the
 30 preceding fiscal year to be so reimbursed.

31 ~~(e)~~ (d) Any moneys which may be available after reimbursing the various
 32 funds or fund accounts as provided in this section shall be transferred
 33 annually to the County Aid Fund by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
 34 Thereafter the Treasurer of State shall transmit them to the respective
 35 county treasurers, as provided by §§ 26-26-1616, 26-26-1701, and 26-26-1707.

1 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARCELS.
 3 The Assessment Coordination Department shall reimburse counties and
 4 professional reappraisal companies monthly up to the maximum cost per parcel
 5 established by rule, multiplied by the total number of parcels in the county,
 6 divided by the number of months in a county's reappraisal cycle. The term
 7 parcel as used herein shall be defined by department rule, and department
 8 reimbursements based upon only the total number of parcels determined to
 9 qualify under department rule. Parcel – All contiguous land capable of being
 10 conveyed on a single deed, except when that tract of land crosses taxing unit
 11 boundaries, township lines, or section lines. Improvement only assessments
 12 are considered a parcel irrespective of the land on which it is located. In
 13 circumstances where land otherwise defined as a parcel by necessity and
 14 convenience must be listed in more than one of the assessor's books (City and
 15 town, Rural, and Rural Platted Sub division) it may be divided into separate
 16 parcels; each portion listed in the appropriate assessor book. Any legal
 17 description shall not be listed on more than one parcel. Ownership of a
 18 parcel by multiple persons does not constitute multiple parcels. Control
 19 cards, information cards, and mineral rights parcels are not to be counted as
 20 parcels for use when applying Act 1185 of 1999.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, 2005
 22 through June 30, 2007.

23
 24 SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
 25 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
 26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
 27 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 28 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 29 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 30 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 31 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 32 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

33
 34 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 35 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 36 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act

1 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
2 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
3 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
4 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
5 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

6
7 SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
11 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
14 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
