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1 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STUDENT LOAN FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. 2 There is hereby appropriated, to be payable from the funds and fund accounts 3 as set out herein, to the Arkansas Student Loan Authority for the biennial 4 period ending June 30, 2007, the following: 5 (a) For the Student Loan Financial Assistance Program, the sum of \$5,301,300 6 for the 2005-2006 fiscal year and \$5,301,300 for the 2006-2007 fiscal year. 7 (1) Program Description. Student Financial Assistance Services is an ASLA 8 initiative to provide a comprehensive college access program. EMPLOYMENT OF ATTORNEYS. None of the funds appropriated in 22 this Act for Maintenance and General Operation shall be expended in payment 23 for services of attorneys, unless the agency shall first make a request in 24 writing to the Attorney General of the State of Arkansas to provide the 25 required legal services. The Attorney General's Office shall provide the 26 requested legal services, or, if the Attorney General's Office shall 27 determine that sufficient personnel are not available to provide the 28 requested legal services, the Attorney General shall certify the same to the 29 agency and may authorize the agency to employ legal counsel and to expend 30 monies appropriated for Maintenance and General Operations therefor, if: 31 The Attorney General determines, and certifies in writing, that such 32 agency needs the advice or assistance of legal counsel, and 33 (2) The Attorney General consents in writing to the employment of the 34 legal counsel to be retained by the agency.

COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 5 6 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 7 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 8 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 9 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 10 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 11 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 12 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 13 14 15 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 16 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 17 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 18 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 19 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 20 21 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 22 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 2.3 24 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 25 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 26 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 27 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of 28 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 29 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 30 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 31 32 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 33 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and 34 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.

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
