12	the title to land purchased at public sales were held inapplicable to tax		
13	sale purchases of severed mineral rights; and that a procedure to establish		
14	the marketability of titles based upon tax sale purchases of severed mineral		
15	rights is needed to permit the transfer or lease of minerals for the good of		
16	the state's economy and its citizens. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
17	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
18	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
19	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
20	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
