SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRAINING 27 28 CONFERENCES. The funds appropriated herein for Aid to County Veterans Service 29 Offices may also be used by the Department of Veteran Affairs to pay expenses of County Veterans Service Officers for attending regional or statewide 30 31 training conferences approved by the Department of Veterans Affairs and 32 designed to provide better trained and qualified Veterans Service Officers in 33 the various counties.
