- 5 <u>be paid for those positions for shifts exceeding the normal day shift of the</u>
- 6 <u>facility</u>. When shift and weekend differentials are provided to employees as
- 7 herein described, the total compensation may exceed the line item maximum
- 8 salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The provisions of this
- 9 section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2007.

- 11 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 13 BEHAVIORAL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community
- 14 Mental Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice
- 15 (excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for
- 16 indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to
- 17 be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
- 18 Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health
- 19 Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to
- 20 the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for
- 21 this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the
- 22 Director of the Department of Human Services shall be apportioned on a per
- 23 capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48)
- 24 per capita for fiscal year 2003-2004 2005-2006 and three dollars and forty-
- 25 eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year 2004-2005 <u>2006-2007</u>. The 2000
- 26 federal population census shall be used in determining the population of each
- 27 catchment area of the fifteen Community Mental Health Centers. All amounts
- 28 appropriated under this section shall be used by Community Mental Health
- 29 Centers for residents of each center's catchment area and such funds shall
- 30 only be accessed as the payment of last resort.

- 32 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 34 REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services shall develop an
- 35 evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made
- 36 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for

- l receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall
- 2 report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services the
- 3 following data:
- 4 (1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
- 5 referred by CMHCs to community-based settings;
- 6 (2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
- 7 to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health
- 8 services funds;
- 9 (3) the total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary
- 10 commitments;
- 11 (4) the total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent
- 12 admissions;
- 13 (5) the average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary
- 14 commitments per catchment area;
- 15 (6) the average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent
- 16 admissions per catchment area;
- 17 (7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to
- 18 receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such
- 19 funds being depleted by prior admissions;
- 20 (8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary
- 21 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings
- 22 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and
- 23 (9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental
- 24 health services.

26 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

- 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE
- 28 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PER CAPITA LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The
- 29 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of
- 30 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago
- 31 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly
- 32 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public
- 33 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care.
- 34 The purpose of this Act the Acute Mental Health Services Per Capita
- 35 <u>appropriation</u> is to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services
- 36 to be utilized within community-based settings for the treatment and care of

- 1 medically indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary
- 2 commitments to the public mental health system. The appropriation for acute
- 3 mental health services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community
- 4 Mental Health Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral
- 5 Mental Health Services of the Department of Human Services for use within
- 6 community-based settings and facilities.

- 8 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DRUG
- 10 COURT RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Department of Human Services Division of
- 11 Behavioral Mental Health Services shall develop administrative rules and
- 12 regulations regarding the distribution of monies from the Magnum Drug Court
- 13 Fund and shall submit such rules and regulations to the Arkansas Legislative
- 14 Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.

- 16 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COMMUNITY
- 18 ALCOHOL SAFETY CARRY FORWARD. Such Community Alcohol Safety appropriation as
- 19 is authorized in this Act which remains at the end of the first fiscal year
- 20 of the biennium may be carried forward into the second fiscal year of the
- 21 biennium there to be used for the same purposes.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 23 July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2005 June 30, 2007.

- 25 SECTION 31. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
- 26 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
- 27 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
- 28 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
- 29 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 30 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 31 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 32 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 33 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

- 35 SECTION 32. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 36 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained

1	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
2	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
3	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
4	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
5	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
6	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
7	
8	SECTION 33. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
9	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
10	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
11	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
12	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
13	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
14	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
15	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
16	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
17	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
18	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
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
