NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL WEEKEND PAY, ANNUAL SALARY SURVEYS AND 23 24 EXPERIENCE ADJUSTMENT FOR REGISTERED AND LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES, MENTAL HEALTH WORKERS AND CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANTS WORKING. All Registered 25 26 Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse and Certified Nursing Assistant 27 classifications employed in areas providing critical support and care to 28 Patient Units at Arkansas State Hospital and Arkansas Health Center during 29 evening and night shifts shall be eligible to receive up to twenty (20) 30 percent of the hourly rate paid as a shift differential. All Registered 31 Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse and Certified Nursing Assistant 32 classifications required to provide critical and support care to Patient 33 Units during weekend hours shall be eligible to receive up to twenty (20) 34 percent of the hourly rate paid as a weekend differential. When facilities 35 use shifts other than traditional eight-hour shifts, shift differential may be paid for those positions for shifts exceeding the normal day shift of the 36

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1	facility. When shift and weekend differentials are provided to employees as
2	herein described, the total compensation may exceed the line item maximum
3	salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The provisions of this
4	section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2007.

6	SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
8	BEHAVIORAL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community
9	Mental Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice
10	(excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for
11	indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to
12	be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
13	Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health
14	Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to
15	the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for
16	this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the
17	Director of the Department of Human Services shall be apportioned on a per
18	capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48)
19	per capita for fiscal year 2003–2004 <u>2005–2006</u> and three dollars and forty-
20	eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year 2004-2005 <u>2006-2007</u> . The 2000
21	federal population census shall be used in determining the population of each
22	catchment area of the fifteen Community Mental Health Centers. All amounts
23	appropriated under this section shall be used by Community Mental Health
24	Centers for residents of each center's catchment area and such funds shall
25	only be accessed as the payment of last resort.

27 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 28 29 REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services shall develop an evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made 30 31 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for 32 receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall 33 report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services the 34 following data:

(1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissionsreferred by CMHCs to community-based settings;

1 (2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions 2 to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health 3 services funds; 4 (3) the total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary 5 commitments; 6 (4) the total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent 7 admissions; 8 (5) the average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary 9 commitments per catchment area; (6) the average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent 10 11 admissions per catchment area; 12 (7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to 13 receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such 14 funds being depleted by prior admissions; 15 (8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary 16 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings 17 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and (9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental 18 19 health services. 20 21 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. 23 The

24 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of 25 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago 26 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly 27 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public 28 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care. 29 The purpose of this Act the Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita 30 appropriation is to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services 31 to be utilized within community-based settings for the treatment and care of 32 medically indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary 33 commitments to the public mental health system. The appropriation for acute 34 mental health services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community 35 Mental Health Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral 36 Mental Health Services of the Department of Human Services for use within

1 community-based settings and facilities.

3 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DRUG 5 COURT RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Department of Human Services - Division of 6 <u>Behavioral Mental</u> Health Services shall develop administrative rules and 7 regulations regarding the distribution of monies from the Magnum Drug Court 8 Fund and shall submit such rules and regulations to the Arkansas Legislative 9 Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.

11 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COMMUNITY 13 ALCOHOL SAFETY CARRY FORWARD. Such Community Alcohol Safety appropriation as 14 is authorized in this Act which remains at the end of the first fiscal year 15 of the biennium may be carried forward into the second fiscal year of the 16 biennium there to be used for the same purposes.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003

20 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE 22 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - SOUTHEAST ARKANSAS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CENTER. Of the 23 total amount appropriated each fiscal year in Section 9 of this Act for Acute Mental Health Services - Per Capita, two hundred fifty thousand dollars 24 25 (\$250,000) each fiscal year shall first be allocated and made available to 26 the Southeast Arkansas Behavioral Health Center for Acute Mental Health 27 Services. The remaining five million five hundred thousand dollars 28 (\$5,500,000) appropriated each fiscal year shall be allocated and made 29 available to the Community Mental Health Centers within community-based 30 settings on a per-capita basis. 31

32 The Division of Behavioral Health will work with the community mental health

33 <u>centers and shall develop an equitable acute care distribution plan which</u>

34 <u>considers utilization of State Hospital beds, clarifying target population</u>,

35 *and other pertinent demographic factors to ensure maximum equitable*

36 <u>utilization of public funds.</u>

2	The Division of Behavioral Health shall report this distribution plan to the
3	Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee by July 1, 2006. The
4	intent of the 85 th General Assembly is that this language is for the 2005-07

6	as continuing special language for the 2007-09 biennium.

8	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
9	through June 30, 2007.

11	SECTION 32. Arkansas Code § 19-5-1043, concerning the Drug Abuse
12	Prevention and Treatment Fund, is amended to read as follows:
13	19-5-1043. Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund.
14	(a) There is hereby established on the books of the Treasurer of State,
15	Auditor of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as
16	the Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund.
17	(b) This fund shall consist of <u>:</u>
18	<u>(1) Those</u> those moneys transferred or deposited from the State
19	Administration of Justice Fund <u>;</u>
20	(2) Such General Revenue as transferred from Mental Health Services Fund
21	<u>Account;</u>
22	(3) Federal reimbursement received on account of eligible expenditures;
23	and
24	(4) Other funds as may be provided by law.
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26	SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
27	by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
28	made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
29	restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
30	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
31	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
32	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
33	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
34	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
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36	SECTION 34. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

1	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
2	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
3	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
4	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
5	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
6	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
7	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
8	
9	SECTION 35. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
10	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
11	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
12	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
13	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
14	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
15	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
16	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
17	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
18	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
19	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
