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23	Section 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter	9, is amended to add an
24	4 additional subchapter to read as follows:	
25	<u>20-9-1001. Title.</u>	
26	This subchapter shall be known and may be c	ited as the "Acute Stroke
27	7 <u>Care Act of 2005".</u>

29	9 <u>20-9-1002</u> . Findings.	
30	The General Assembly finds that:	
31	(1) The citizens of the State of Ark	ansas are entitled to the
32	2 maximum protection practicable from the effects o	f strokes;
33	(2) Each year about seven hundred th	ousand (700,000) Americans
34	experience a new or recurrent stroke;	
35	(3) On average, a stroke strikes som	eone every forty-five (45)
36	seconds and someone dies of a stroke every three	and one-tenth (3.1) minutes:

1	(4) Stroke is the leading cause of serious, long-term disabilit		
2	in the United States, with about four million seven hundred thousand		
3	(4,700,000) stroke survivors alive today;		
4	(5) Stroke is the third leading cause of death in the United		
5	States, causing fifty-seven and seven-tenths (57.7) deaths per one hundred		
6	thousand (100,000) population; and		
7	(6) In Arkansas, the death rate from stroke is seventy-five and		
8	nine-tenths (75.9) per one hundred thousand (100,000), the highest in the		
9	nation.

11	20-9-1003. Acute Stroke Care Task Force Creation.		
12	(a) There is created an Acute Stroke Care Task Force to consist of		
13	twelve (12) members.		
14	(b) The Director of the Department of Health shall appoint:		
15	(1) One (1) member to represent the Department of Health;		
16	(2) One (1) member to represent the American Heart Association		
17	and the American Stroke Association;		
18	(3) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Minority Health		
19	Commission;		
20	(4) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Hospital		
21	Association;		
22	(5) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Foundation for		
23	Medical Care;		
24	(6) One (1) member to represent the University of Arkansas for		
25	Medical Sciences College of Public Health;		
26	(7) One (1) member to represent the Division of Medical Services		
27	of the Department of Human Services;		
28	(8) One (1) member to represent emergency medical services;		
29	(9) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Medical Society;		
30	(10) One (1) member to represent the medical insurance industry;		
31	(11) One (1) member to represent the community at large; and		
32	(12) One (1) member to represent the Arkansas Medical, Dental,		
33	and Pharmacy Association.		
34	(c)(1) Except for the initial members, task force members shall serve		
35	three year terms.		
36	(2) The initial members shall be assigned by lot so as to		

T	stagger terms to equalize as hearly as possible the number of members to be		
2	appointed each year.		
3	(d) If a vacancy occurs, the Director of the Department of Health		
4	shall appoint a person who represents the same constituency as the member		
5	being replaced.		
6	(e) The task force shall elect one (1) of its members to act as chair		
7	for a term of one (1) year.		
8	(f) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the		
9	transaction of business.		
10	(g) The task force shall meet as necessary to further the intent and		
11	purpose of this subchapter.		
12	(h) The Department of Health shall provide office space and staff for		
13	the task force.		
14	(i) Members of the task force shall serve without pay but may receive		
15	expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-902, if funds are available		
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17	20-9-1004. Powers and duties.		
18	The Acute Stroke Care Task Force shall:		
19	(1) Make recommendations to the State Board of Health consisten		
20	with the intent and purpose of this subchapter;		
21	(2) Pursue both public and private funding to further the inten		
22	of this subchapter; and		
23	(3) Develop standards and policy recommendations considering,		
24	but not limited to, the following:		
25	(A) Methods for raising public awareness of the prevalence		
26	and treatment considerations for strokes;		
27	(B) The professional development of emergency medical		
28	services professionals to identify victims of potential stroke;		
29	(C) The professional development of emergency room and		
30	hospital personnel to identify and treat victims of potential stroke;		
31	(D) Methods for encouraging the use of thrombolytics,		
32	clot-busting drugs, or other accepted or emerging treatments, when		
33	appropriate;		
34	(E) Methods for ensuring that a comprehensive range of		
35	stroke recovery services are available to Arkansans as they recover physical		
36	and mental functions affected by a Stroke:		

1	(F) Methods for developing stroke treatment centers; and	
2	(G) Methods for developing a stroke registry for Arkansas.	
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4	20-9-1005. State Board of Health Powers and duties.	
5	The State Board of Health after consultation with the Acute Stroke Care	
6	Task Force and if funds are available may promulgate rules to further the	
7	intent of this subchapter.	
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9	20-9-1006. Expenses Minority Health Commission.	
10	All expenses incurred in furtherance of the intent of this subchapter	
11	shall be taken evenly from the existing budgets of the Department of Health	
12	and the Arkansas Minority Health Commission.	
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
