3	(i) No less than thirty (30) days prior to a	
4	regularly scheduled State Board of Education meeting, request a hearing on	
5	the matter before the State Board of Education and file a petition to have

15	6-20-604. Additional funding.
16	(a)(1) The General Assembly finds that school consolidations and
17	annexations required by Act 60 of the 2nd Extraordinary Session of the
18	Eighty-Fourth General Assembly and new requirements under the Standards for
19	Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools adopted by the State Board of
20	Education have disproportionately increased the cost of operations for school
21	districts that contained isolated schools.
22	(2) The General Assembly further finds that school districts
23	which contained isolated schools need additional funding to provide an
24	adequate education for students attending schools in those districts.
25	(b) A school district shall receive special needs funding as set forth
26	under subsections (c) through (e) of this section if the school district
27	meets the following requirements of subsections (c) through (e) of this
28	section, and:
29	(1) The school district was consolidated or annexed under Act 60
30	of the Second Extraordinary Session of the Eight-Fourth General Assembly;
31	(2) The local board of directors by majority vote determines
32	that a school within its district that is an isolated school area for grades
33	kindergarten through twelve (K-12) listed in § 6-20-603 is so isolated that
34	to combine its operation to one (1) district campus would be impractical or
35	unwise; and
36	(3) The Director of the Department of Education determines that

1	to combine the isolated school's operation to one (1) district campus would:
2	(A) Cause students riding a school bus to have a minimum
3	travel time in excess of one hour and thirty minutes (1 hr 30 min) one-way;
4	<u>or</u>
5	(B) Place students in harm's way due to a high-risk travel
6	route based on the topography or geographic location of the district.
7	(c) A school district meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of
8	this section shall receive an additional amount equal to twenty percent (20%)
9	of the foundation funding received by the school district under § 6-20-
10	2305(a)(2) for the operation of the isolated school areas if the district
11	has:
12	(1) School facilities open for grades kindergarten through
13	twelve (K-12) in two (2) or more isolated school areas listed in § 6-20-603;
14	(2) A three-quarter average daily membership of five hundred
15	(500) or less in the preceding school year; and
16	(3) A density ratio of one and three-tenths (1.3) students or
17	less per square mile.
18	(d) A school district meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of
19	this section shall receive an additional amount equal to fifteen percent
20	(15%) of the foundation funding received by the school district under § 6-20-
21	2305(a)(2) for the operation of the isolated school areas if the district
22	has:
23	(1) School facilities open for grades kindergarten through
24	twelve (K-12) in two (2) or more isolated school areas listed in § 6-20-603;
25	(2) A three-quarter average daily membership of five hundred and
26	one (501) to one thousand (1,000) in the preceding school year; and
27	(3) A density ratio of one and four tenths (1.4) students or
28	less per square mile.
29	(e) A school district meeting the requirements of subsection (b) of
30	this section shall receive an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the
31	foundation funding received by the school district under § 6-20-2305(a)(2)
32	based on the three-quarter average daily membership of the isolated school
33	area under § 6-20-2305(a)(2) if the district has school facilities open for
34	grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) in one (1) or more isolated school
35	areas listed in § 6-20-603.
36	(f) A school district eligible for special needs funding under this

1	section shall continue to be eligible to receive isolated school funding
2	provided under § 6-20-603.
