23	(a)(1) Each artist trainer and apprentice shall complete a blood-borne
24	pathogens course approved by the Department of Health.
25	(2) Each artist trainer shall complete the course before
26	training any apprentice.
27	(3) Each apprentice shall complete the course before applying
28	for the examination required under § 20-27-1507.
29	(b)(1)(A) The department shall promulgate rules to establish standards
30	for the blood-born pathogens course required under this section.
31	(B) The course shall require a minimum of two (2) hours of
32	direct instruction.
33	(2) The course may be taught by providers approved by the
34	department, including, but not limited to:
35	(A) The American Red Cross;
36	(B) Any nationally recognized body art organization;

6	(a) No artist trainer may train more than two (2) apprentices at any

17	(a)(1) Each apprentice seeking licensure as an artist under the rules

21	written examination and the practical examination, no apprentice may:

31	(a) The Department of Health may issue a temporary demonstration	
32	license to an artist, studio, or business that performs body piercing,	
33	branding, or tattooing or to a supplier of materials for body piercing,

35	(1) Educational purposes;	
36	(2) Trade shows; and	

1	(5) Demonstrations of body preferring, branding, of tattooring

3	(b) A temporary demonstration license shall be valid for no more than
