3	program" means a program offered by a pharmaceutical manufacturer through		
4	which the manufacturer provides a drug or drugs to eligible persons at no		
5	charge or at a discounted cost.

7	20-77-1603. Program established.		
8	(a) The Arkansas Pharmaceutical Connection Program is established to		
9	help seniors and the uninsured in accessing all manufacturer-sponsored		
10	prescription drug assistance programs and other programs for which they would		
11	qualify including, but not limited to, Medicare Part D prescription drug		
12	coverage.		
13	(b) The Department of Human Services shall administer the program and		
14	shall utilize a toll-free telephone number and website as the point of		
15	contact for those eligible to participate in the program.		
16	(c) Eligibility shall be limited to residents of the state who:		
17	(1) Have a gross income that does not exceed two hundred fifty		
18	percent (250%) of the federal poverty guidelines;		
19	(2) Have no prescription drug coverage other than Medicare Part		
20	D; and		
21	(3) Have not voluntarily canceled a state or federal		
22	prescription drug program or a private prescription reimbursement plan within		
23	six (6) months prior to application to enroll in the program.

26	(a) The Department of Human Services shall provide assistance to		
27	persons determined to be eligible for services authorized by this subchapter.		
28	The assistance provided shall include:		
29	(1) Assisting persons in accessing manufacturer-sponsored		
30	prescription drug assistance programs for which they are or may be eligible;		
31	(2) Assisting persons in applying for manufacturer-sponsored		
32	prescription drug assistance programs for which they are or may be eligible;		
33	(3) Disseminating information about and advertising available		
34	programs that can provide assistance with obtaining prescription drugs at a

2	(b)(1) The department may seek and receive voluntary moneys, including			
3	grants and gifts to assist with the implementation of the Arkansas

5	(2) The department shall include within the development of the			
6	program the assistance of foundations, independent and chain community			
7	pharmacists, volunteers, state agencies, community groups, area agencies on			
8	aging, corporations, hospitals, physicians, and any other entity that can			
9	further the intent of the program.

11	20-77-1605. Reporting			
12	The Department of Human Services shall prepare and submit an annual			
13	report on the Arkansas Pharmaceutical Connection Program to the Governor,			
14	President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives			
15	and the Joint Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare and Labor. This			
16	report shall include the number of clients served, the number of			
17	prescriptions filled and refilled, and the value of the drugs and services			
18	provided.			
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
