10 NUMBERS OR OUTBOARD MOTOR SERIAL NUMBERS; AND FOR
11 OTHER PURPOSES.

13 THE BOAT IDENTIFICATION ACT.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
19

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 101 is amended to add an
21 additional subchapter to read as follows:

22 27-101-701. Title.

23 The title of this subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the
24 “Boat Identification Act”.

25
26 27-101-702. Definitions.

27 For the purposes of this subchapter:

28 (1)(A) “Boat identification number” means a number assigned to
29 boating equipment by the manufacturer of the boating equipment or the Boating
30 Law Administrator’s Office of the Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission.

31 (B) “Boat identification number” shall include the
32 following:

33 (i) A hull identification number;

34 (ii) An outboard motor serial number;

35 (iii) Any other number placed on a piece of boating
36 equipment under assignment from the Boating Law Administrator’s Office of the



1 Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission; or

2 (iv) Any other distinguishing number or mark
3 assigned to a piece of boating equipment by the manufacturer for
4 identification purposes; and

5 (2) "Boating equipment" means:

6 (A) A motorboat, personal watercraft, or other vessel as
7 defined under § 27-101-103; or

8 (B) An outboard motor.

9
10 27-101-703. Boating equipment without boating identification numbers.

11 (a) It is unlawful for a person to knowingly buy, receive, dispose of,
12 sell, offer for sale, or have in his or her possession boating equipment from
13 which the boat identification number has been removed, defaced, covered,
14 altered, or destroyed for the purpose of concealing or misrepresenting the
15 identity of the boating equipment.

16 (b)(1) A person who pleads guilty to, nolo contendere to, or is found
17 guilty of a violation under subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a
18 Class A misdemeanor.

19 (2) A person who pleads guilty to, pleads nolo contendere to, or
20 is found guilty of a second or subsequent offense under this section is
21 guilty of a Class D felony.

22
23 27-101-704. Altering or changing boating identification numbers.

24 (a) It is unlawful for a person with fraudulent intent to deface,
25 destroy, or alter the boating identification number or to place a boating
26 identification number on boating equipment that was not assigned by the
27 manufacturer or the Boating Law Administrator.

28 (b) A person who pleads guilty to, nolo contendere to, or is found
29 guilty of a violation under subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a
30 Class C felony.

31
32 27-101-705. Mutilation of boating identification numbers.

33 (a) It shall be unlawful for a person or other entity to have in his
34 or her possession boating equipment with the boating identification number
35 that has been mutilated to the extent that it cannot be read.

36 (b) If a piece of boating equipment has been stolen and recovered with

1 a mutilated boating identification number, then a court of competent
2 jurisdiction shall:

3 (1) Authorize the rightful owner of the boating equipment to
4 continue the use of the equipment; and

5 (2) Direct the owner of the boating equipment to have the
6 original boating identification number replaced or restenciled on the piece
7 of boating equipment.

8 (c) A person who pleads guilty to, nolo contendere to, or is found
9 guilty of a violation under subsection (a) of this section is guilty of a
10 Class D felony.
