CONTRACT 14 15 RESTRICTIONS (PHYSICIAN TEACHERS AND TEACHERS IN OTHER HEALTH RELATED 16 PROFESSIONS) AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. Funds appropriated by this Act 17 may be utilized for the purpose of contracting with physician-teachers and teachers in other health related professions residing only at sites located 18 19 away from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Such funds are to be paid only for the purpose of teaching residents and students assigned to 20 Area Health Education Centers. Contracts entered into with physician-

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 30 PROVISIONS FOR UNCLASSIFIED PATIENT CARE PERSONNEL. All unclassified positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for 31 32 Medical Sciences are eligible for overtime at the rate of one and one-half 33 times their regular hourly rate. 18	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
19	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
20	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
21	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
22	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
23	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
24	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
25	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
