AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30, 2007; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS FOR MEDICAL SCIENCES APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2005-2007 BIENNIUM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

4 LANGUAGE AND RESTRICTIONS - AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. The Chancellor at
5 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall make periodic progress
6 reports of AHEC programs to the Governor, the Legislative Council, and other
7 interested interim committees of the General Assembly regarding the
8 achievements, the expansion of the aforementioned programs, and amounts
9 expended for the Area Health Education Centers.

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
11 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.
12

13 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CONTRACT
15 RESTRICTIONS (PHYSICIAN TEACHERS AND TEACHERS IN OTHER HEALTH RELATED
16 PROFESSIONS) AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. Funds appropriated by this Act
17 may be utilized for the purpose of contracting with physician-teachers and
18 teachers in other health related professions residing only at sites located
19 away from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Such funds are to
20 be paid only for the purpose of teaching residents and students assigned to
21 Area Health Education Centers. Contracts entered into with physician-
22 teachers, teachers in other health related fields and their associates shall
23 require the prior approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State only and
24 be reported quarterly to the Legislative Council.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
26 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.
27

28 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
30 PROVISIONS FOR UNCLASSIFIED PATIENT CARE PERSONNEL. All unclassified
31 positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for
32 Medical Sciences are eligible for overtime at the rate of one and one-half
33 times their regular hourly rate. In addition to overtime, those unclassified
34 patient care employees scheduled to work shifts outside of normal operating
35 schedules may be eligible to receive up to twenty-four (24) percent of the
36 hourly rate paid as a shift differential. In addition, all unclassified

positions employed to provide patient care at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences will be eligible to receive incentive pay not to exceed 1.2 times their base hourly rate. Employees required to be available for duty on nights, weekends and holidays will be eligible to receive standby pay equivalent of up to four hours of work per shift. Employees required to work in specialty areas will be eligible to receive up to ten (10) percent of the hourly rate paid as a specialty differential while working in such areas. When overtime, shift differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or specialty differential are provided to employees as herein described, the total may exceed the line item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. The positions of Patient Care Administrator, Associate Administrator, and Assistant Administrator of Patient Care as authorized in regular salaries-operations section of this Act shall be excluded from coverage of this Section. In addition, the Board of Trustees may also make special compensation allowances available, in such amounts as the Board may determine or justify equitable in view of the current requirements for Registered Nurses in the Clinical Programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the availability of Registered Nurses for employment in the Little Rock metropolitan area. However, under no condition shall the special allowances approved by the Board of Trustees for a single individual exceed the state line item maximum by more than 20% for those positions included in this Act.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DAY CARE. Of the funds appropriated in the appropriations-operations section of this Act, \$250,000 each year of the biennium may be allocated as the State's portion of the operating cost of a Child Care Facility of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Individuals using this facility will be charged a daily rate as determined by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the general revenue appropriations and funds provided by this Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2004~~ 2006, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available for the same purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

Any unexpended balance of cash fund appropriations provided by this Act which remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2004~~ 2006, not to exceed ten percent (10%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made available as contingency for the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STIPENDS. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is hereby authorized to pay stipends to students engaged in post-graduate clinical training in accredited programs of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, from "Regular Salaries" or "Maintenance and General Operation", as follows:

SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each year of the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-

1 2007 biennium into the College of Medicine. Provided that no funds shall be
2 expended to fund the positions of Chancellor, Dean of Medicine and any
3 academic position until the Chancellor and Dean of Medicine certify to the
4 Arkansas Legislative Council that the provision of this Section relating to
5 the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium requirement for one hundred fifty (150)
6 freshman student admissions has been implemented.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~

12 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical
13 Sciences may designate up to forty-five per cent (45%) of the regular gross
14 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or
15 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used
16 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the
17 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-
18 404(11).

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~
20 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

21
22 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT
24 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is
25 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend
26 provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of
27 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
28 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
29 of reporting, as provided by Section 1 of Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~

33 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
35 PROVISIONS FOR ON-CALL STATUS AND STAND-BY AND SHIFT DIFFERENTIAL PAY FOR
36 CERTAIN CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES WORKING IN CRITICAL AREAS. All classified

1 positions employed in areas providing critical and emergency support of the
2 clinical and physical operations of the University of Arkansas for Medical
3 Sciences and required to work outside their normal work schedule shall be
4 eligible for on-call status and to receive stand-by pay not to exceed four
5 hours of work per shift. In addition, these employees may be eligible to
6 receive up to fifteen (15) percent of the hourly rate paid as a shift
7 differential. When shift differentials and standby pay are provided to
8 employees as herein described, the total compensation may exceed the line
9 item maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act.

15 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher
16 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium
17 a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level not
18 to exceed \$113,588 ~~-\$107,904~~ per year. These positions are to be used by the
19 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal
20 services needs of the University during the ~~2003-2005~~ 2005-2007 biennium
21 exceed the number of positions allocated to the University by the
22 Legislature. The University shall provide justification to the Arkansas
23 Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles from this
24 "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such
25 time as specific positions are requested by the University, approved by the
26 University Board or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council.
27 Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of
28 Management Services of the Department of Finance and Administration shall

30 hundred (300) classified positions at up to a grade 26. These positions are
31 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event
32 that the personal services needs of the University during the ~~2003-2005~~
33 2005-2007 biennium exceed the number of positions in a classification
34 allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide
35 justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".
36 No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific

1 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
2 by the Legislative Council.

3 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is
4 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
5 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
6 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
7 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
8 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
9 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
10 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
11 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
12 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
13 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
14 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of
15 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
16 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
17 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
18 void.

19 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
20 established herein during the next biennium, the position(s) must be
21 requested as a new position(s) in the agencies biennial budget request.
22 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005
23 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

24
25 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Child and
27 Family Life Institute. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be
28 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
29 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
30 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
31 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
32 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
33 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
34 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
35 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
36 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not

1 limited to, wellness and prevention, screen and diagnosis, treatment and
2 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
3 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
4 Department of Pediatrics shall make ~~semi~~-annual reports to the Arkansas
5 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
6 offered through CHFLI.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect from July 1, ~~2003~~ 2005
8 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

9
10 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

12 PURCHASING DEFINITIONS. (Z) Commodities and services for use in research,
13 education and treatment for the diagnosis, cure and prevention of disease
14 may, with administrative approval, be procured through a group purchasing
15 entity serving other public health institutions when substantial savings are
16 available. A report shall be filed annually with the Division of Legislative
17 Audit reflecting the justification of and the estimated savings accruing due
18 to the use of this exemption;

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~
20 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

21
22 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 19-4-906(a), Item No. (119),
23 is amended as follows:

26 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING
28 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
29 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,
30 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking
31 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~
33 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

35 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER

1 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
2 Program Loans and / or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
3 Scholarship Program Loans and / or Scholarships have the goal of providing
4 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
5 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for

14 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
16 BALANCES. The Board of Trustees in its official governing capacity charged
17 with the management or control of the institution of higher learning and the
18 President or Chancellor as the Chief Executive shall certify to the Chief
19 Fiscal Officer of the State and the Legislative Council that as of December
20 31 of each year that sufficient appropriations and funds are available, or
21 will become available, to meet all current and anticipated obligations during
22 the fiscal year for the payment of the obligations when they become due.

35 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
36 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures

1 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
2 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
3 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
4 with in disbursement of said funds.

6 SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
7 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
8 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
9 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
10 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
11 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
12 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
13 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

15 SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
16 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
17 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
18 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
19 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
20 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
21 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
22 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
23 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
24 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
25 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
