SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. The Arkansas 8 Department of Higher Education, if necessary, shall re-adjust the number of 9 positions for entering students to be funded for each applicable program 10 based upon the priorities determined by the board.

Upon certification to and with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 3 4 State, surplus funds and appropriations may be transferred between the 5 appropriations provided for "Health Education Grants" by this Act by the 6 Eighty Fourth Eighty-Fifth General Assembly for Dental Aid, Optometry Aid, 7 Veterinary Aid, Podiatry Aid, Chiropractic Aid and Osteopathic Aid. 8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 9 July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2005 June 30, 2007. 10 11 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 6-63-312 concerning 12 contingency appropriations for higher education is amended to read as 13 follows: 14 6-63-312. Contingency appropriations - Transfers and reports. 15 (a) Upon approval by the Department of Higher Education and the Chief 16 Fiscal Officer of the State, institutions of higher education may transfer 17 appropriation from the cash contingency appropriation to any other 18 appropriation made to the institution from cash funds - and institutions may 19 transfer appropriation from the contingency appropriation made payable from each institution's State Treasury Fund to the state operations appropriation 20 made payable from each institution's State Treasury Fund. 21 22 (b) The department shall report monthly to the Legislative Council these 23 appropriation transfers, and the report shall include, by institution, the 24 amounts transferred, and the reasons therefor and the source of the funds. 25 26 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STUDENT 28 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP (SURF) PROGRAM. The focus of the Student Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) Program is the continued development 29 30 of undergraduate academic research efforts at Arkansas colleges and universities. The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall adopt rules 31 32 and regulations necessary for the proper administration of the Student 33 Undergraduate Research Fellowship Program. Administrative functions and responsibilities may include, but not necessarily be limited to, the 34 35 development of eligibility criteria, collection of applications, coordination of student evaluations, distribution of public notices, and funding of grants 36

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1 for academic research purposes. Staff of the Arkansas Department of Higher 2 Education shall administer this program. The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall be authorized to expense costs associated with the 3 administration of the program, from funds made payable from the Higher 4 5 Education Grants Fund Account for the Student Undergraduate Research 6 Fellowship Program as authorized in Section 4 of this Act. 7 8 SECTION 33. Any two-year institution of Higher Education that has its main or 10 11 a satellite campus located within a twenty five mile radius of any four-year institution of higher education shall enter into a written agreement with 12 that four-year institution which must address duplication of services between 13 14 the institutions. 15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 16 through June 30, 2007. 17 SECTION 34. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 18 19 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 20 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 21 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 22 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 23 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 24 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 25 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 26 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 27 28 SECTION 35. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 29 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 30 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 31 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 32 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 33 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 34 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or

35 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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1	SECTION 36. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
2	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
3	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
4	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
5	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
6	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
7	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
8	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
9	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
10	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
11	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
