CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TURNBACK

- 1 FUNDS. Any Federal Mineral Leasing Funds, Federal Forest Reserve Funds,
- 2 Federal Flood Control Funds, or any similar turnback funds in the State
- 3 Treasury for which the eligible county and/or school district cannot be
- 4 identified may be transferred to the Department of Education Public School
- 5 Fund Account and used for any lawful school purpose.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <del>2003</del> 7 2005 through June 30, <del>2005</del> 2007.

- 9 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. YEAR-END
- 11 FUND BALANCE. Notwithstanding any law pertaining to the transfer of year-end
- 12 fund balances or any law to the contrary, any funds which remain in the
- 13 Department of Education Fund Account at the end of a fiscal year shall remain
- 14 in the Department of Education Fund Account and made available to fund
- 15 appropriation authorized by law and made payable from the Department of
- 16 Education Fund Account for the following fiscal year.
- 17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2003}{1}$
- 18 2005 through June 30, <del>2005</del> 2007.

- 20 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SALARY OF
- 22 THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. It is the intent of the
- 23 General Assembly that the appropriation for the salary of the Director of the
- 24 Department of Education shall be the sole and exclusive authority for his or
- 25 <u>her salary. It is further the intent of the General Assembly that the</u>
- 26 Director be required to devote all of his or her working time exclusively to
- 27 the performance of his or her duties as Director of the Department of
- 28 Education. Therefore, the Director of the Department of Education is hereby
- 29 prohibited from accepting any additional salary from any other source
- 30 (including state, federal, or private entities or persons) for the
- 31 performance of his or her duties as Director, and is prohibited from
- 32 accepting any salary, fees or compensation from any other source (including
- 33 state, federal or private entities or persons) for any other employment of
- 34 any kind outside the scope of his or her duties as Director, including but
- 35 not limited to consulting work for any other public or private entity. This
- 36 section shall not be construed to prohibit the Director from accepting or

1	receiving expense reimbursements and employee benefits as provided by State
2	<u>law.</u>

4	SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
6	FEASIBILITY STUDY. The Department of Education shall authorize and fund a
7	feasibility study costing up to two hundred fifty thousand dollars
8	(\$250,000). The purpose of the study shall be to evaluate and determine
9	whether the Pulaski County Special School District should continue in
10	existence by specifically addressing and evaluating the following: 1) the
11	elimination of the Pulaski County Special School District and redrawing of
12	school district boundaries in Pulaski County to form one school district
13	north of the Arkansas River and one district south of the Arkansas River; 2)
14	the elimination of the Pulaski County Special School District and redrawing
15	of school district boundaries in Pulaski County to form three districts
16	including a Little Rock District south of the Arkansas River, a North Little
17	Rock District north of the Arkansas River and a Jacksonville School District
18	north of the Arkansas River; 3) whether the elimination of the Pulaski County
19	Special School District under either option would further desegregation
20	efforts of the districts and help all districts in gaining unitary status and
21	in ending the desegregation case; and, 4) to study and propose a plan to
22	pursue the end of desegregation litigation in Pulaski County.
23	A contract shall be signed no later than October 31, 2005 and the
24	feasibility study completed no later than June 30, 2006.
25	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
26	through June 30, 2007.
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28	SECTION 23. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
29	authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
30	and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
31	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
32	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
33	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
34	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
35	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
36	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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2	SECTION 24. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
3	that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
4	in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
5	was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
6	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
7	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
8	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
9	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
10	
11	SECTION 25. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
12	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
13	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
14	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
15	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
16	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
17	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
18	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
19	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
20	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
21	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
