7	thousand five hundred one dollars ($\$5,501$) times multiplied by the average

EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 32 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that to provide an opportunity for 33 adequate education for the children of Arkansas the schools must have good 34 quality teachers in the classrooms; that increases in teacher's salaries are 35 necessary to attract and retain good quality teachers; that changes in

teacher salary requirements must be in place before May 1 of each year to

Т	ensure that changes may be incorporated into teacher contracts in a timely
2	manner; and that this act is immediately necessary because school districts
3	and teachers need sufficient notice of salary changes to negotiate and enter
4	into contracts for the upcoming school year. Therefore, an emergency is
5	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
6	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
7	on:
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
11	bill; or
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
