7 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 9 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 14 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXPLOR-16 NET FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total appropriation authorized by this Act for 17 Technology Grants the Department of Education shall make available one hundred eighty seven thousand five hundred seventy five dollars (\$187,575) 18 19 each fiscal year for Explor-Net Program initiatives to teach students 20 computer repair in a hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall 21 allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred eighty 22 seven thousand five hundred seventy five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year 23 from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to support the 24 Explor-Net Program. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 25 expenditure the monies allocated for the Explor-Net Program in order to 26 fulfill the provisions of this section.

30 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS 32 LEADERSHIP ACADEMY - REDUCTION OF FUNDS RESTRICTION. Upon determination by 33 the Department of Education that a reduction in the amount of available 34 appropriation within the Department of Education Fund Account is required 35 from the amount appropriated, the reduction in the available appropriation 36 from the full amount appropriated for the Arkansas Leadership Academy shall

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1 be limited to the average percentage reduction in the other appropriations to 2 the Department of Education from the Department of Education Fund Account. 3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 4 2005 through June 30, 2005 2007. 5 6 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE 7 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DISTRESSED 8 SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item "Distressed <u>School District Support" in Section 1 of the Act may be used for technical</u> 9 10 assistance offered by the Department of Education to school districts in 11 academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, teacher 12 specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 13 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 14 15 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 16 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 17 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 18 19 school district participating in the program. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 20 21 through June 30, 2007. 22 23 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER CHANCE 24 PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby 25 26 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds to 27 administer the program and to monitor program grantees to ensure compliance 28 with programmatic standards. 29 The Department may contract with the Division of Child Care and Early

30 <u>Childhood Education to administer the program.</u>

31 <u>The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005</u>
 32 <u>through June 30, 2007.</u>

34 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHARTER
 36 SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS. Regardless of any provision of any law to the

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1 contrary, the Department of Education shall fund from state monies only those 2 charter schools which provide education services in a traditional public 3 school setting and, if the internet or long-distance learning technology is 4 used, the internet or long-distance learning technology is used as a 5 supplement to the school's traditional classroom setting.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
7 <u>2005</u> through June 30, 2005 <u>2007</u>.

SECTION 23. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 9 10 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 11 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 12 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 13 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 14 15 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 16 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 17 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

18

SECTION 24. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 20 21 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 22 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 23 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 24 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 25 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 26 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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28 SECTION 25. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 29 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 30 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of 31 32 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 33 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the 34 35 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 36

1	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
2	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
