6 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 8 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 9 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 10 11 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 12 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 13 14 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 15 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 16 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 17 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 18 19 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 20 21 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. Such 22 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 23 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 24 as is deemed necessary.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2003}{2005}$ through June 30, $\frac{2005}{2007}$.

(A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004 and for each fiscal year thereafter, 18 19 the Department of Education shall from time to time as needed, certify to the 20 State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the amount of 21 funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the Department of Education 22 for desegregation expenses under any the "Pulaski County School Desegregation 23 Settlement Agreement." Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 24 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-25 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct up to, but not to exceed in total for fiscal 26 year 2003-04 the sum of \$32,800,000 from the net general revenues the amount 27 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 28 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 29 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 30 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement." (B) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, the Department of Education 31 32 shall from time to time as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the 33 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the amount of funds disbursed for 34 desegregation expenses under the "Pulaski County School Desegregation 35 Settlement Agreement." 11	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of
12	State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
13	"Educational Adequacy Fund".
14	(b) After the Treasurer of State has made deductions from the revenues
15	under § 19-5-203(b)(2)(A), the Educational Adequacy Fund shall consist of:
16	(1) All net revenues collected due to enactments of the Eighty-Fourth
17	General Assembly meeting in Second Extraordinary Session, unless a different
18	distribution of those additional net revenues is otherwise provided in the
19	act creating those additional net revenues;
20	(2) The revenues credited to the Educational Adequacy Fund under § 26-54-
21	113(b)(2);
22	(3) The revenues generated by §§ 26-52-302(d), 26-53-107(d), 26-52-316, and
23	26-57-1002(d)(1)(A)(ii); and
24	(4) Other revenues as provided by law.
25	(c)(1) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State will determine, from time to
26	time, the amount of funds required from the Educational Adequacy Fund which,
27	when added to other resources available to the Department of Education Public
28	School Fund Account and the Department of Education Fund Account, is needed
29	to fulfill the financial obligation of the state to provide an adequate
30	educational system as enacted by the Eighty-Fourth General Assembly meeting
31	in Second Extraordinary Session as authorized by law and shall certify the
32	amounts to the Treasurer of State.
33	(2) At the end of each month, the Treasurer of State shall transfer all
34	moneys available from the Educational Adequacy Fund to the Department of
35	Education Public School Fund Account of the Public School Fund and to the
36	Department of Education Fund Account of the Education Fund, until the sum of

1 all transfers from the Educational Adequacy Fund equal the amounts determined 2 in subdivision (c)(1) of this section, there to be used as determined by law. (d) In the event the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State determines that the 3 4 transfers from the Educational Adequacy Fund, when added to the other 5 resources available to the Department of Education Public School Fund 6 Account, are not sufficient to meet the state's financial obligation to 7 provide an adequate educational system as enacted by the Eighty Fourth 8 General Assembly meeting in Second Extraordinary Session as authorized by 9 law, the additional amount required shall be transferred from the other funds and fund accounts within § 19-5-402(a) and § 19-5-404(a) based upon the 10 11 proportion that each of the remaining fund and fund accounts bears to the total of the remaining funds and fund accounts in § 19-5-402(a) and § 19-5-12 13 404(a).

15 SECTION 36. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 16 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 17 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 18 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 19 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 20 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 21 22 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 23 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 37. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 25 26 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 27 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 28 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 29 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 30 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 31 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 32 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

34 <u>SECTION 38. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the General 35 <u>Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the</u> 36 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the

1	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
2	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
3	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
4	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
5	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
6	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
7	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
8	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
