2	and Transportation, which shall begin operation within one hundred twenty
3	(120) calendar days following June 3, 2004 operate under the supervision of
4	the Commission on Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-19-107 is amended to read as follows: 6-19-107. Bus drivers - Application for employment - Driving records.

- (a) An applicant for employment as a school bus driver shall submit an application prescribed by the Department of Education Division of Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation to the school district in which he or she seeks employment. The application shall include a statement signed by the applicant which authorizes the release of his or her traffic violation report from the Office of Driver Services of the Department of Finance and Administration to provide the school district with the applicant's driving record.
- (b) The Office of Driver Services shall report the applicant's driving record, without charge, to the school district requesting such record.
- (c) The applicant's driving record shall be evaluated according to guidelines established by the Department of Education Division of Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation prior to permanent employment. The school district may hire an applicant as a bus driver on a temporary basis until official verification of the driving record is received and evaluated. The school district shall review and maintain a file of semiannual reports on the driving records of school bus drivers.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-19-108(a) is amended to read as follows:

(a) An applicant seeking employment as a driver or operator of a school bus, either privately or publicly owned, is required to take and pass a series of tests as prescribed by the Department of Arkansas State Police and the Department of Education Division of Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation to determine the physical fitness and driving ability to serve as a school bus driver. The tests shall include a physical examination given by a licensed physician or registered nurse for school bus drivers, an eye test, a written or oral test on rules and regulations of driving, a road test given under the supervision of the Department of Arkansas State Police, and such other requirements as may be prescribed by rules and regulations issued jointly by the Department of Arkansas State Police and the Department of Education Division of Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation

- 1 for qualifications and fitness of school bus drivers. In addition, the
- 2 applicant shall participate in and pass a standard bus driver training and
- 3 preservice behind-the-wheel training program as prescribed by the Department
- 4 of Education Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
- 5 Transportation.

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- 7 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-19-108(d) is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (d) Each school bus driver who seeks a renewal of his or her bus
- 9 driver certificate shall provide proof that he or she has satisfactorily
- 10 passed a physical examination given by a licensed physician and that he or
- 11 she has satisfactorily completed an in-service workshop for school bus
- 12 drivers as prescribed by the Department of Education <u>Division of Public</u>
- 13 School Academic Facilities and Transportation.

- 15 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-19-116 is amended to read as follows:
- 16 6-19-116. Bus mirrors.
- 17 (a) Every school bus used for the transportation of pupils to or from
- 18 school shall be equipped with one (1) or more mirrors of sufficient size so
- 19 positioned on the bus as to permit the driver to see clearly the area
- 20 immediately in front of the bus.
- 21 (b) The Department of Education Division of Public School Academic
- 22 Facilities and Transportation is authorized to adopt appropriate rules and
- 23 regulations as it deems necessary to carry out the intent and purposes of

- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 6-19-117(e) and (f), pertaining to school

36 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General

1	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court has
2	determined that current public school academic facilities in Arkansas are
3	inadequate and inequitable; that the General Assembly established the Joint
4	Committee on Educational Facilities to inventory the current condition of
5	public school academic facilities and recommend methods for bringing those
6	facilities into conformity with the court's constitutional expectations; that
7	the Division of Public School Academic Facilities and Transportation is
8	charged with the administration of a comprehensive state program for
9	overseeing the provision of constitutionally appropriate public school
10	academic facilities across the state; and that the division must be given
11	authority to immediately begin work on developing programs to provide
12	constitutionally appropriate public school academic facilities for the
13	benefit of public school students in the State of Arkansas. Therefore, an
14	emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for
15	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
16	effective on:
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
20	bill; or
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
