3	(A) One (1) member who is the Chair of the House Committee
4	on Education or his or her designee;
5	(B) Two (2) members of the House Committee on Education to
6	be appointed by the Chair of the House Committee on Education; and
7	(C) Four (4) members of the House of Representatives to be
8	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
9	(3) The Director of the Division of Public School Academic
10	Facilities and Transportation who shall serve as a nonvoting ex officio
11	member.
12	(c) The Chair of the Senate Committee on Education or the chair's
13	designee and the Chair of the House Committee on Education or the chair's
14	designee shall serve as cochairs of the committee.
15	(d) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position for any reason, the
16	vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
17	(e)(1) The committee shall meet upon the call of either or both of the
18	cochairs of the committee.
19	(2) Eight (8) members of the committee shall constitute a quorum
20	for the purpose of transacting business.
21	(3) A quorum is required for any action of the committee.
22	
23	10-3-2202. Powers and duties.
24	(a) The Academic Facilities Oversight Committee shall:
25	(1) Oversee development and implementation of state statutory
26	requirements with regard to providing constitutionally appropriate public
27	school academic facilities and related equipment for all public schools in
28	the State of Arkansas as necessary to provide an equal opportunity for an
29	adequate education for all public school students in Arkansas;
30	(2) Appoint members of the Advisory Committee on Public School
31	Academic Facilities established to assist the Division of Public School
32	Academic Facilities and Transportation;
33	(3) Review and recommend policies and criteria for the repair,
34	maintenance, renovation, remodeling, replacement, and construction of public
35	school academic facilities;
36	(4) Oversee local and state expenditures related to providing

1	constitutionally appropriate public school academic facilities and related	
2	equipment;	
3	(5) Review the effectiveness of methods used to fund the cost of	
4	constitutionally appropriate public school academic facilities and equipment;	
5	(6) Review the ongoing assessment, evaluation, and inspection of	
6	public school academic facilities to provide that constitutionally	
7	appropriate public school academic facilities are, and will continue to be,	
8	provided for public school students in Arkansas; and	
9	(7) Use the opinions of the Arkansas Supreme Court in the matter	
10	of Lake View School District No. 25 of Phillips County, Arkansas, et al., v.	
11	Governor Mike Huckabee, et al. and other legal precedent relevant to public	
12	school academic facilities.	
13	(b)(l)(A) The committee shall report its findings and recommendations	
14	to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of	
15	Representatives, the Governor, and the House and Senate Committees on	
16	Education no later than October 1 before each regular session of the General	
17	Assembly.	
18	(B) Upon motion of the committee and approval by a quorum	
19	of the committee, the October 1 report deadline may be extended for a period	
20	to be determined by the committee.	
21	(2) The report shall include for each recommendation, proposed	
22	implementation schedules with timelines, specific steps, agencies and persons	
23	responsible, and resources needed.	
24	(3) Where feasible, the committee shall propose plans, measures,	
25	and initiatives as recommendations for legislation or regulation.	
26		
27	10-3-2203. Committee assistance.	
28	(a) The Department of Education, the Department of Workforce	
29	Education, the Department of Higher Education, the Division of Public School	
30	Academic Facilities and Transportation, and the Division of Public School	
31	Accountability shall provide the Academic Facilities Oversight Committee with	
32	assistance as requested by the committee.	
33	(b) The committee may hire or contract with individuals or entities,	
34	both within the state and from out-of-state, for the purpose of obtaining	
35	staff or otherwise performing the duties of the committee to the extent	
36	funding is appropriated and available for that purpose.	

1	(c) The Bureau of Legislative Research of the Legislative Council
2	shall furnish reasonable staff assistance to the committee as may be
3	requested by the committee.
4	
5	10-3-2204. Meetings - Reimbursement of expenses.
6	(a) The Academic Facilities Oversight Committee shall function during
7	the interim between regular or special sessions of the General Assembly,
8	while the General Assembly is in session, and while the General Assembly is
9	in recess.
10	(b) If the committee meets at a time when the General Assembly is not
11	in session, the legislative members of the committee are entitled to per diem
12	and mileage reimbursement at the rate as for attending meetings of the
13	Legislative Council. The per diem or mileage reimbursement shall be paid
14	from funds appropriated for the payment of per diem and mileage for
15	attendance at meetings of interim committees of the General Assembly.
16	
17	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 21, Subchapter 1 is amended
18	to add the following additional sections:
19	6-21-113. Advisory Committee on Public School Academic Facilities.
20	(a) To assist the Division of Public School Academic Facilities and
21	Transportation, there is established the Advisory Committee on Public School
22	Academic Facilities to be composed of the following members who must be
23	willing to devote adequate time to the work of the committee:
24	(1) The Director of the Division of Public School Academic
25	Facilities, or the director's designee, who shall also serve as secretary to
26	the advisory committee;
27	(2) Two (2) persons who are licensed building contractors with
28	at least five (5) years of experience in public school construction;
29	(3) One (1) person who is a registered architect with at least
30	five (5) years of experience in public school design;
31	(4) One (1) person who is a licensed or registered engineer with
32	at least five (5) years of experience in public school construction;
33	(5) One (1) person who is knowledgeable in educational
34	technology applications and strategies;
35	(6) Two (2) persons selected from a list of six (6) names
36	submitted by the Arkansas Association of Educational Administrators;

1	(7) One (1) person selected from a list of three (3) names	
2	submitted by the Arkansas Education Association; and	
3	(8) One (1) person selected from a list of three (3) names	
4	submitted by the Arkansas School Boards Association.	
5	(b) All members shall serve four-year terms. All terms shall expire	
6	on April 1. Membership is limited to two (2) terms.	
7	(c) Nonstate employee committee members shall serve without	
8	compensation, but may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-	
9	<u>16-902.</u>	
10		
11	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
12	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court has	
13	determined that current public school academic facilities in the State of	
14	Arkansas are inadequate and inequitable; that the General Assembly	
15	established the Joint Committee on Educational Facilities to inventory the	
16	current condition of school facilities and recommend methods for bringing	
17	those facilities into conformity with the court's constitutional	
18	expectations; that one of the recommendations of the joint committee is to	
19	authorize the Division of Public School Academic Facilities to begin work	
20	immediately as a viable state agency; that the new division immediately	
21	needs, and will continue to need, the advice of an advisory committee	
22	$\underline{\text{comprised}}$ of members with expertise in public school design and $\underline{\text{construction}}$	
23	and with issues particular to providing adequate and equitable public school	
24	academic facilities; that an advisory committee with the necessary expertise	
25	does not currently exist; that in response to the work of the joint	
26	$\underline{\text{committee,}}$ the General Assembly is in the process of developing and enacting	
27	$\underline{\text{legislation designed to establish a comprehensive program for overseeing } \underline{\text{the}}$	
28	provision of adequate and substantially equal public school academic	
29	facilities across the state; that the General Assembly immediately needs, and	
30	will continue to need, the advice of an organized legislative committee	
31	comprised of members with expertise in issues particular to providing	
32	adequate and equitable public school academic facilities; and that an	
33	organized legislative committee with the necessary expertise does not	
34	currently exist. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act	
35	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health	
36	and safety shall become effective on:	

1	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
2	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4	bill; or
5	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
