25	established the Joint Committee on Educational Facilities to inventory the

30	immediately as a viable state agency; that the new division immediately

12	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
13	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
14	bill; or

16	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
