30	established the Joint Committee on Educational Facilities to inventory the	
31	current condition of school facilities and recommend methods for bringing

34	establish a new advisory body to evaluate distance learning capabilities in	
35	the public schools; that the establishment of the Distance Learning	
36	Coordinating Council satisfies the recommendations of the joint committee:	

1	and that in order to promote the state's efforts to satisfy constitutional
2	expectations with regard to an adequate education, the new coordinating
3	council needs to begin work with the fiscal year beginning July, 2005.
4	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
5	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
6	become effective on July 1, 2005.
