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1 2 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - REAPPROPRIATION AND CARRYOVER. There is hereby 3 appropriated, to the Arkansas Senate, to be payable from the Constitutional 4 Officers Fund or the State Central Services Fund, whichever is appropriate, 5 for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the balance of the 6 appropriations enacted by the Eighty-fifth General Assembly to defray the 7 expenses of the Arkansas Senate of the Eighty-fifth General Assembly, as 8 enacted by Section 1 of Act 2 of 2005; Section 3 of Act 3 of 2003; Sections 9 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Act 1149 of 2003; Act 292 of 2003; Act 2 of the Second 10 Extraordinary Session of 2003, and Act 36 of the Second Extraordinary Session 11 of 2003, in a sum in the aggregate not to exceed......\$4,800,000. 12 13 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - COMPUTERIZATION. There is hereby appropriated, 14 to the Arkansas Senate, to be payable from the State Central Services Fund, 15 for expenses necessary in continuing the computerization of the legislative 16 process in the Arkansas Senate, the sum of......\$700,000. 17 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - RENOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS. There is hereby 18 19 appropriated, to the Arkansas Senate, to be payable from the State Central 20 Services Fund, for construction, improvements, renovations and equipping of 21 the Arkansas Senate facilities and other purposes of the Arkansas Senate, the 22 sum of.....\$700,000. 2.3 24 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 10-2-102 is amended to read as 25 follows: 26 10-2-102. Duties of Secretary of Senate, Senate Chief of Staff, Clerk of 27 House, and other officers. 28 (a) The Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of 29 Representatives, with their respective clerical forces, shall perform all 30 duties required in the engrossment and enrollment of bills and all necessary 31 work as clerks of committees. 32 (1) The Secretary of the Senate, the Senate Fiscal Officer, the Senate 33 Assistant Fiscal Officer, and the Senate Properties Officer employees of the 34 Senate shall perform such duties during the regular session of the General 35 Assembly and during the interim between the convening of special sessions and

the next regular session of the General Assembly as may be provided by the

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- 1 rules of the Senate or by the Senate Efficiency Committee, subject to the 2 approval of the Senate.
- 3 (2) The Senate Chief of Staff shall be appointed by the Senate Efficiency
 4 Committee subject to the approval of the Senate.
- 5 (3) The Senate Chief of Staff shall hereafter perform all duties imposed 6 upon the Secretary of the Senate by law with respect to contingent expenses, 7 contracts, procurement, and the inventory report to the Secretary of State.

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- 9 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 10-2-125 is amended to read 10 as follows:
- 11 10-2-125. Employees and officers.
- 12 (a) The House Management Committee with the approval of the Speaker of the
- 13 House of Representatives may employ at its discretion House employees and may
- 14 transfer or discharge any employee if it is deemed for the best interest of
- 15 the House of Representatives.
- 16 (b)(1)(A) The Senate Efficiency Committee at its discretion and subject to
- 17 the approval of the Senate may employ, transfer, or discharge Senate
- 18 employees if it is determined by the committee to be in the best interest of
- 19 the Senate.
- 20 $\frac{(B)(2)}{(B)(2)}$ The actual salaries to be paid to employees of the Senate shall be
- 21 determined by the Senate Efficiency Committee within the funds,
- 22 appropriations, and maximum annual salaries as may be available.
- 23 (2) The Senate Fiscal Officer, the Senate Assistant Fiscal Officer, the
- 24 Secretary of the Senate, and the Senate Properties Officer shall report
- 25 directly to and be responsible directly to the Senate Efficiency Committee,
- 26 subject to the approval of the Senate.

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- 28 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
- 30 FORWARD. Any balance remaining on June 30, 2004 June 30, 2006 in the
- 31 appropriation provided by Section 2 of this Act for Maintenance and General
- 32 Operations shall be carried forward and made available for the fiscal year
- 33 ending June 30, 2005 June 30, 2007 for the same purposes.

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- 35 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

1 TRANSFERS. If the Senate Efficiency Committee and the Senate Fiscal Officer, 2 subject to the approval of the Arkansas Senate, should determine that any item or portion thereof appropriated herein for a specific purpose is not 3 4 needed for such purpose, the Senate Fiscal Officer may certify such fact to 5 the State Auditor and the State Auditor shall cause a transfer to be made 6 from one item to another. 7 8 SECTION 11. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 9 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 10 11 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 12 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 13 14 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 15 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 16 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 17 SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 18 19 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 20 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 21 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 22 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 23 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 24 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 25 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 26 27 SECTION 13. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 28 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 29 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 30 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 31 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective 32 33 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the 34 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. 35 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being 36 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
