23	SECTION 1. Ark	ansas Code § 24-4-401(b)(1), concer	ning contributions of
24	members under the Ark	ansas Public Employees' Retirement	System, is amended to

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- 1 (3) The contributions shall be deducted on each and every payroll, for each and every payroll period, from the date of the member's entrance into the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System to the date his or her membership terminates.
- 5 (4) When deducted, each of the amounts shall be paid by the 6 public employer to the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System Fund and 7 shall be credited to the individual account in the members' deposit account 8 of the member from whose compensation the contributions were deducted.
- 9 (5) The contributions provided for in this section shall be made 10 notwithstanding that the minimum salary or wages for any member shall be 11 thereby changed.
- 12 (6) Each member shall be deemed to consent and agree to the 13 deductions made and provided for in this section.
- 14 (7) Payment of a member's compensation less deductions shall be
 15 a full and complete discharge and acquittance of all claims and demands
 16 whatsoever for services rendered to a public employer by the member, except
 17 as to benefits provided by this act.

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- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 24, Chapter 4 is amended to add an additional subchapter to read as follows:
- 21 24-4-1101. Membership.
- 22 (a) All public employees, as defined in § 24-4-101(17), first hired on
 23 or after July 1, 2005, are subject to the benefit provisions of this
 24 subchapter.
- 25 (b)(1) All public employees hired prior to July 1, 2005, and who are
 26 active members of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System on July 1,
 27 2005, shall have six (6) months from July 1, 2005, to elect coverage under
 28 the benefit provisions of this subchapter.
- 29 (2) No conversion or purchase of noncontributory service into contributory service under this subchapter is allowed.
- 31 (3) The election shall be made as directed by the Board of
 32 Trustees of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System and is
 33 irrevocable.
- 34 (c) Noncontributory members who terminate covered service for a period
 35 of more than six (6) months and subsequently return to covered service will
 36 be subject to the provisions of this subchapter.

1	24-4-1102. Member contributions.		
2	(a)(1) The contributions of a member shall be five percent (5%) of th		
3	member's annual compensation, and shall be placed in the member's deposit		
4	account as provided in § 24-4-401.		
5	(2) Interest shall be paid on accumulated member contributions		
6	at the rate of four percent (4%) per annum.		
7	(b) A member whose service is credited at a rate other than as define		
8	in § 24-4-101(2) shall contribute five percent (5%) times the service		
9	multiplier used in calculating the member's benefits.		
10	(c)(l) For purposes of deferring federal and state income tax under		
11	26 U.S.C. § 414(h)(2), as adopted by § 26-51-414, the employer shall pick up		
12	the member's contributions to the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement		
13	System required by this section payable on or after July 1, 2005.		
14	(2)(A) Member contributions picked up by the employer shall be		
15	paid from the same source of funds used for the payment of salary to a		
16	member.		
17	(B) A deduction shall be made from each member's salary,		
18	equal to the amount of the member's contribution picked up by the employer.		
19	(C) For all other purposes, member contributions picked u		
20	by the employer shall be considered member contributions.		
21	(d) Upon termination of covered service, a former member may request a		
22	refund of the former member's accumulated contributions under § 24-4-603,		
23	except that interest will be credited on all balances for service through th		
24	last completed fiscal year as provided in § 24-4-209(a).		
25			
26	24-4-1103. Benefits generally.		
27	(a) Upon retirement under this subchapter, a member shall receive a		
28	straight life pension equal to two percent (2%) of the member's final average		
29	compensation multiplied by the number of years and any fraction of a year of		
30	the member's service.		
31	(b) Any member may voluntarily retire upon filing a written		
32	application with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Public Employees'		
33	Retirement System not less than thirty (30) days nor more than ninety (90)		
34	days before the date the member desires to be retired if that member has:		
35	(1) Twenty-eight (28) or more years of credited service		
36	regardless of age; or		

1	(2) Attained or attains age sixty-five (65); and		
2	(3)(A) Has five (5) or more years of actual service.		
3	(B) However, a member of the General Assembly must have		
4	ten (10) or more years of actual service if the member only has service as a		
5	member of the General Assembly.		
6	(c) No temporary annuity will be provided to members covered by this		
7	subchapter.		
8	(d) The maximum benefit payable upon retirement shall be one hundred		
9	percent (100%) of the member's final average compensation, without regard to		
10	any postretirement increases enacted by the General Assembly.

12	24-4-1104. Annuity options.		
13	Before the date the first payment of a member's annuity is due, a		
14	member may elect to receive the annuity as a straight life annuity or as one		
15	of the reduced annuity options provided in § 24-4-606.		
16			
17	24-4-1105. Deferred and early annuities.		
18	(a) Any member or former member with sufficient years of actual		
19	service to qualify for a vested termination annuity who has not attained		
20	normal retirement age may retire with an early annuity provided in § 24-4-		
21	<u>510.</u>		
22	(b) In the event a member with five (5) years or more of actual		
23	service in the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System ceases employment		
24	as a covered member before reaching sixty-five (65) years of age or attaining		
25	twenty-eight (28) years of service and does not withdraw his or her		
26	accumulated employee contributions to the system, the member is entitled to		
27	receive an annuity upon attainment of sixty-five (65) years of age and		
28	submission of a retirement application to the system.		
29	(c) If a former member has applied for a refund of contributions but		
30	returns to employment with a participating public employer prior to the date		
31	the refunded contributions are received, the request is void and employment		
32	must be terminated again to request a refund of contributions.		
33			
34	24-4-1106. Benefits - Death of retirant.		
35	(a) In the event a retirant receiving a straight life pension dies		
36	before the retirant has received an aggregate amount of straight life pension		

- 1 payments equal to the accumulated contributions credited in the retirant's
- 2 deposit account at the time of retirement, the difference between the
- 3 <u>accumulated contributions and the aggregate amount of straight life pension</u>
- 4 payments received by the retirant is paid to the named beneficiary.
- 5 (b) If no designated person survives the retirant, the difference, if
- 6 any, shall be paid in accordance with the laws of descent and distribution of
- 7 the State of Arkansas.
- 8 (c) The payments may be made directly to a curator, guardian,
- 9 <u>administrator</u>, or executor authorized to receive the payments with or without
- 10 the appointment of a representative in this state.
- 11 (d) No benefits will be paid under this section if survivor benefits
- 12 are otherwise payable to a named beneficiary.

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- 14 <u>24-4-1107</u>. Redetermination of benefits.
- 15 <u>(a) Each July 1 the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System shall</u>
- 16 redetermine the amount of each monthly benefit that has been payable by the
- 17 system for at least twelve (12) calendar months. The redetermined amount is
- 18 payable for the following twelve (12) calendar months.
- 19 <u>(b) The redetermined amount is the amount of the benefit payable as of</u>
- 20 the immediately preceding July 1 increased by three percent (3%).

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- 22 24-4-1108. Benefit provisions Death in service.
- 23 (a)(1) If an active member or former member with less than five (5)
- 24 years of actual service dies while employed by a covered employer, the
- 25 member's accumulated contributions and interest are refundable to the named
- 26 beneficiary.
- 27 (2) If no designated person survives the member, the accumulated
- 28 contributions will be paid in accordance with the laws of descent and
- 29 distribution of the State of Arkansas.
- 30 (3) The payments may be made directly to a curator, guardian,
- 31 <u>administrator</u>, or executor authorized to receive the payments with or without
- 32 the appointment of a representative in this state.
- 33 (b) If an active member or former member with five (5) or more years
- 34 of actual service dies before retirement, the benefits under this section
- 35 will be paid upon written application to the Board of Trustees of the
- 36 Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System as provided in § 24-4-508.

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2	24-4-1109. Maximum benefit limitation.		
3	(a) Benefits paid under this chapter shall not exceed the limitations		
4	of Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code that are applicable to		
5	governmental retirement plans.		
6	(b)(1) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Public Employees'		
7	Retirement System is authorized to promulgate all rules necessary to		
8	implement the limitations of Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code.		
9	(2) The rules adopted by the board under this section shall be		
10	amended to reflect any changes in the content or application of Section 415		
11	of the Internal Revenue Code enacted by Congress or promulgated by the		
12	Internal Revenue Service.		
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14	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
15	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that for the effective		
16	administration of this act and to avoid undue harm to the members and benefit		
17	recipients of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System that this act		
18	should become effective on July 1, 2005. Therefore, an emergency is declared		
19	to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public		
20	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2005.		
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
