14 TO AMEND THE GENERAL ACCOUNTING AND
15 BUDGETARY PROCEDURES LAW TO ALLOW THE
16 PAYMENT OF VOUCHERS FROM THE ARKANSAS
17 DISTRICT JUDGE RETIREMENT SYSTEM FUNDS.
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 19-4-1107(6)(D), concerning supporting
24 documents for the disbursement of state funds from the state's public
25 retirement systems, is amended to read as follows:

26 (D) In the case of vouchers written upon the Arkansas
27 Public Employees' Retirement System Fund, the Arkansas Local Police and Fire
28 Retirement System Fund, the State Police Retirement System Fund, the Arkansas
29 Judicial Retirement System Fund, the Arkansas District Judge Retirement
30 System, and the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System Fund for retiree benefits,
31 the Auditor of State shall process paper or electronic warrants to pay the
32 vouchers upon certification by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State that
33 funds are available from the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System,
34 the Arkansas Local Police and Fire Retirement System, the State Police
35 Retirement System, the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System, the Arkansas
36 District Judge Retirement System, and the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System



1 funds with which to pay the warrants when they shall be presented for
2 payment.

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4 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
5 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the vouchers written on the
6 Arkansas District Judge Retirement System should be paid at the time of
7 presentment upon certification of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State that
8 funds are available; and that the expenses of the Arkansas District Judge
9 Retirement System are a just expense of the state that must be paid.
10 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
11 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
12 become effective on:

13 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

14 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
15 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
16 bill; or

17 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
18 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
