17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

19 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 82, Subchapter 2 is
20 repealed.

21 ~~6-82-201. Legislative findings and intent—Purpose of subchapter.~~
22 ~~(a)(1) The General Assembly, giving due consideration to the~~
23 ~~historical and continuing interest of the people of Arkansas in encouraging~~
24 ~~able and deserving students to realize their aspirations for postsecondary~~
25 ~~education, finds and declares that postsecondary education for residents of~~
26 ~~this state who desire such an education and are properly qualified therefor~~
27 ~~is important to the welfare and security of this state and nation and,~~
28 ~~consequently, is an important public service.~~

29 ~~(2) The General Assembly finds and declares that the state can~~
30 ~~achieve its full economic and social potential only if every individual has~~
31 ~~the opportunity to contribute to the full extent of his or her capabilities~~
32 ~~and only when financial barriers to his or her economic, social, and~~
33 ~~educational goals are removed.~~

34 ~~(b) It is, therefore, the policy of the General Assembly and the~~

5 ~~As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires:~~

6 ~~(1) "Academic ability" means the intellectual standing of the~~
7 ~~student. In determining academic ability, the department shall examine the~~
8 ~~student's high school or college records or certified evidence therefrom on~~
9 ~~which the application is based, requiring proof of academic achievement and~~
10 ~~the capacity to profit from postsecondary education. Admission to an approved~~
11 ~~private or public institution does not automatically meet academic ability~~
12 ~~qualifications;~~

13 ~~(2) "Approved private institution" means a nonprofit two-year or~~
14 ~~four-year degree-granting institution of postsecondary education or an~~
15 ~~institution offering completion of an occupational training program as~~
16 ~~defined by the federal government, dedicated to educational purposes, located~~
17 ~~in Arkansas which:~~

18 ~~(A) Is operated privately under the control of an~~
19 ~~independent board and not directly controlled or administered by any public~~
20 ~~agency or political subdivision;~~

 2 private or public institution in a course of study leading to an associate's

 4 who is enrolled in at least twelve (12) semester hours or some other
 5 reasonable academic equivalent as defined by the department; and

6 (8) "Qualified student" means a full-time student who meets the
 7 criteria of academic ability and financial need, as determined by the
 8 department, and who has demonstrated that a state scholarship is warranted.

1 ~~A state scholarship may be allotted for one (1) academic year but shall~~

4 ~~private or public institutions that the student has been admitted, is in~~
5 ~~attendance at such school, and is making satisfactory progress in his or her~~

9 ~~The state scholarship is to be awarded directly to the student, in the~~

14 ~~If a recipient of a state scholarship at any time withdraws from an~~

27 ~~6-82-213. Legislative intent—Enhancement of student assistance grant~~
28 ~~program.~~

29 ~~(a) It is the intent of the General Assembly to significantly increase~~
30 ~~support for the student assistance grant program, previously known as the~~
31 ~~state scholarship program, in order to provide increased assistance to~~
32 ~~students and to raise the proportions of Arkansans attending institutions of~~
33 ~~higher education to match the national average within a ten-year period. To~~
34 ~~reach these objectives, it is the intent of the General Assembly to guard~~
35 ~~against continuing inflation and to accommodate the projected increase in the~~
36 ~~percentage of high school students going on to postsecondary education by~~

1 ~~providing a significant increase in funding for the student assistance grant~~
2 ~~program during the 1989-1991 biennium and an additional increase of ten~~
3 ~~percent (10%) each year for ten (10) years, beginning with the 1991-1992~~
4 ~~fiscal year.~~

22 The Department of Higher Education shall administer all state college
23 financial assistance programs provided for by legislation or by law and in so
24 doing shall have the following authority and responsibility with respect to
25 state college financial assistance programs provided for by legislation or by
26 law:
