29	(B) Such efforts shall include coordination across			
30	agencies for evaluations, the provision of services based on assessments and			
31	evaluations that result in the development of an interagency service plan,			
32	the review for adequacy of services through client progress, and maintaining			
33	cooperation among agencies;

1 (B) When utilizing a group process for reaching service 2 delivery decisions, the group shall be composed of those who carry sufficient 3 authority to assure ensure timely provision of services; 4 "CASSP" means the Child and Adolescent Service System (3) 5 Program; 6 "Child with emotional disturbance" means an individual under (4) 7 the age of eighteen (18), or under the age of twenty-one (21) if program 8 services began prior to before the age of eighteen (18); 9 (A) who Who is exhibiting inappropriate emotional, 10 interpersonal, or behavioral problems within the home, preschool program, 11 school, or community given his or her age, intellectual level, and cultural 12 background; 13 (B) whose Whose degree of dysfunction is at least 14 disruptive and often disabling, 15 (C) whose Whose problems persist after efforts to deal 16 with the problems have been made by significant others in the child's social 17 environment; and 18 (D) who Who meets specific criteria established by the 19 Child and Adolescent Service System Program Coordinating Council; 20 (5)(A) "Collaborative evaluation" means an intensive appraisal 21 of a child that provides more of an in-depth analysis than a screening and 22 assessment. 23 (B) The evaluation shall be designed, obtained, and 24 utilized collaboratively by those agencies identifying a need for the 25 information; 26 (6) (A) "Flexible funds" means a specific fiscal allocation 27 designated for atypical expenditures to meet extraordinary needs of a child 28 and family identified in the service plan. 29 (B) Decisions for expenditure of flexible funds shall be 30 made at the regional or local level and must shall be approved by all 31 involved service providers; 32 "Interagency service plan" means the integrated plan of care (7) 33 that is individualized for each child or adolescent receiving program services and is developed through the collaboration of all agencies providing 34 services for that child; 35 36 (8)(A) "Regional plan" means a written strategy developed by

regional program teams that specifies the kind, mix, and priority of services 1 2 to be provided in each community mental health center catchment area. 3 (B) The regional plan shall: 4 (i) address Address all components of the system of 5 care,; 6 (ii) shall be Be based on the principles for the 7 system of care provided in this section and on the service needs of the 8 children with emotional disturbance in the region, 9 (iii) shall include Include procedures for 10 evaluating services provided to children with emotional disturbance and their 11 families,; and 12 (iv) shall be Be reviewed annually by the council; 13 and 14 (v) upon Upon approval shall be incorporated into 15 the statewide plan; 16 (9) "Screening and assessment" means an initial appraisal of a 17 child identified or suspected of having emotional disturbance that provides 18 sufficient information to make decisions about service needs; 19 "Service array" means those services in the system of care (10) that address the varying areas of needs of children with emotional 20 21 disturbance and their families and shall include, but not be limited to: 22 mental health services, substance abuse services, social services, education 23 services, health services, vocational services, recreational services, 24 operational services, case management, advocacy, and other necessary 25 services; 26 (11) "Single point of entry" means a unit, agency, or group 27 designated as the gatekeeper for the service system for children with 28 emotional disturbance and their families; 29 (12)(11) "Statewide plan" means a comprehensive strategy that 30 identifies the procedures for developing and implementing the system of care 31 that is prepared by the council incorporating all regional plans; and 32 (12) "System of care" means a comprehensive spectrum of 33 mental health and other necessary services organized into a coordinated 34 network to meet the multiple and changing needs of children with emotional disturbance, based on principles set forth in this subchapter. 35 36

1 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-47-505 is amended to read as follows: 2 20-47-505. Child and Adolescent Service System Program Coordinating 3 Council. 4 (a)(1) There is hereby created a Child and Adolescent Service System 5 Program Coordinating Council which that shall meet on a quarterly basis and 6 at other times deemed necessary to perform its functions. 7 (2) The coordinating council shall include the following persons 8 to be selected and appointed by the directors of the Department of Education, 9 the Department of Health, and the Department of Human Services: 10 (A) At least three (3) parents, parent surrogates, or 11 family members of a child or children with emotional disturbance; 12 (B) A member of an ethnic minority; 13 (C) A child advocate; 14 (D)(i) Fifteen (15) Child and Adolescent Service System 15 Program coordinators from each of the certified community mental health 16 centers to be selected by nomination and vote by the county Child and Adolescent Service System Program coordinators. 17 18 (ii) Three (3) Child and Adolescent Service System 19 Program members shall be chosen from each of the five (5) Department of Human 20 Services' catchment areas; 21 (E)(i) One (1) or more representatives from specific 22 divisions or agencies in the Department of Human Services, the Department of 23 Health, and the Department of Education. 24 (ii) Each representative shall have official duties 25 related to the delivery of mental health services for children and 26 adolescents with emotional disturbances. 27 (iii) Specific designations of membership of the coordinating council shall be determined through interdepartmental and 28 29 intradepartmental agreements that will be renewed on an annual basis; and 30 (F)(1)(i) At least two (2) representatives from private or public agencies or organizations that are stakeholders in mental health 31 32 services for children and adolescents with emotional disturbances At least 33 four (4) representatives from private providers who are not designated as 34 community mental health centers. 35 (ii) At least two (2) from the four (4) representatives under subdivision (a)(2)(F)(i) shall be from the Arkansas 36

(a) A regional Child and Adolescent Service System Program planning
 team shall be established in each community mental health center catchment
 area of the five (5) Department of Human Services' catchment areas.

4 (b)(1) Each team shall include individuals who are not state employees
5 and who are not providers of services to children with emotional disturbance
6 or their families but who are parents, parent surrogates, family members, or
7 consumers.

8 (2) Every effort shall be made to encourage and assist parents, 9 parent surrogates, family members, consumers, and advocates to participate in 10 program planning teams.

(c) The regional program planning teams shall include agency
 representatives from the community mental health centers, private providers
 not designated as community mental health centers, if the providers are
 providing services in the region, the Division of Developmental Disabilities

(f) The regional program planning team shall:

(1) Advise and report to the Child and Adolescent Service System
Program Coordinating Council <u>and to the regional Arkansas Mental Health</u>
<u>Planning and Advisory Council</u> on matters of policies, resources, programs,
and services relating to children with emotional disturbance and their
families;

29 (2) Identify and recommend program initiatives and revisions30 based on area and community-based needs;

31 (3) Submit a regional plan and guidelines for interagency
32 service delivery teams to the coordinating council on or before February 15
33 of each even-numbered year preceding the legislative session;

34 (4) Develop and implement special projects for community-based
 35 services; and

(5)(A) Ensure that interagency service teams are established and

3 (B) Each service delivery team shall have sufficient and 4 appropriate representation from identified service providers and will 5 complete an interagency service plan for each child or adolescent receiving 6 program services.

(C) Every effort shall be made to assist parents, parent 7 8 surrogates, family members, and consumers to participate as members of the 9 interagency service delivery team.; and

10 (6) Provide membership to the regional Arkansas Mental Health 11 Planning and Advisory Council as delineated in the bylaws of the council. 12

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-47-507 is amended to read as follows: 13 14 20-47-507. Child and Adolescent Service System Program Coordinating 15 Council staff.

16 The staff for the Child and Adolescent Service System Program (a) 17 Coordinating Council shall be provided by the Child and Adolescent Service 18 System Program project for the first two (2) years and subsequently by the 19 Division of Mental Health Services.

The division will serve as the coordinating agency and shall 20 (b) 21 develop and support the regional county program team network and the 22 coordinating council and shall provide training and technical assistance 23 relevant to the system of care.

24 (c) Annual site reviews and program evaluations of regional county 25 program teams will be coordinated by the division and will involve a 26 multiagency team of professionals, family members, consumers, and advocates.

27 The division's program staff shall provide an annual report (d) 28 summarizing program regional county and coordinating council activities, 29 strategic plans, and outcomes to the directors of the Department of Human 30 Services, the Department of Education, and the Department of Health each year 31 on or before October 15.

33 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-47-508 is amended to read as follows: 34 20-47-508. Evaluation and treatment.

35 (a) Children A child suspected of having emotional disturbance who are 36 is referred for Child and Adolescent Service System Program services shall be

given a screening and assessment through the single point of entry by the
 <u>child's' current provider</u>, after which an initial interagency service plan
 shall be defined and developed.

4 (b) The community mental health centers are hereby designated as the
5 single point of entry Entry into services designed by the Child and
6 Adolescent Service System Program team shall be obtained following existing
7 procedures in the Department of Human Services.

8 (c) The assessment shall be conducted by the community mental health
9 center serving the area in which the child or adolescent lives.

10 (d) The community mental health center <u>Providers of Rehabilitative</u> 11 <u>Services for Persons with Mental Illness services</u> shall be accessible on a 12 twenty-four-hour basis, shall accept referrals from multiple sources, have 13 interagency linkages, involve parents, ensure immediate access to crisis 14 intervention services, and have authority to seek needed services.

15 (e)(1) If after screening and assessment or collaborative evaluations 16 it is determined that a child with emotional disturbance needs multiagency 17 services, then initial and subsequent individualized multiagency service 18 plans for the child and the child's family shall be jointly developed by the 19 appropriate local or regional county representatives of the community mental 20 health centers providers of mental health services, of the Department of 21 Human Services county office, of the Department of Health, of the Special 22 Education Division of the Department of Education, of the local school 23 district, and of any other service provider identified to meet the needs of 24 the child and his or her family.

25 <u>(2)</u> The individualized service plan shall reflect an integrated 26 service delivery that specifies services or programs with funding to be 27 provided by each agency.

28 (3) The service plan shall also designate responsibility for 29 case management.
