35	For purposes of th	is subchapter, the following t	erms shall be defined
36	as indicated:		

1	(1) "Approved institution" means any public or private school or
2	college or any public postsecondary vocational and technical school located
3	in Arkansas which awards postsecondary certificates, degrees, or diplomas.
4	Further, such institution shall not discriminate against applicants,
5	students, or employees on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age,
6	disability, or national origin, consistent with the provisions of applicable
7	state and federal law;
8	(2) "Undergraduate student" means a resident of Arkansas who
9	attends a postsecondary school or college and is enrolled for at least three
10	(3) credit hours per semester or the equivalent, as defined by the Department
11	of Higher Education, in a program of study which leads to a postsecondary
12	certificate, degree, or diploma;
13	(3) "Eligible student" means any student who meets the criteria
14	set out in this subchapter and is deemed to be eligible by rules and
15	regulations authorized by this subchapter and promulgated by the Department
16	of Higher Education;
17	(4)(A) "Tuition" means charges levied for attendance at an
18	eligible institution.
19	(B) For purposes of this subchapter, tuition charges shall
20	not include any fees charged or used for student activities, including any
21	student athletic fee.
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23	6-82-1103. Eligibility - Number of scholarships.
24	(a) Eligibility for the Second Effort Scholarship Program shall be
25	based on the criteria set forth in this section as well as program rules and
26	regulations adopted pursuant to this subchapter by the Department of Higher
27	Education.
28	(b) A student shall be eligible for an award from this program if he
29	or she meets all of these criteria:
30	(1) The recipient shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age
31	or a former member of a high school class which has graduated;
32	(2) The recipient shall have been a resident of the State of
33	Arkansas for at least twelve (12) months prior to successful completion of
34	the General Educational Development Test;
35	(3) The recipient must be a citizen of the United States or be a
36	permanent resident alien;

1	(4) The recipient must be accepted for admission at an approved
2	postsecondary school or college as a freshman, as defined by the Department
3	of Higher Education, and must enroll in an approved institution within
4	eighteen (18) months following passage of the General Educational Development
5	Test;
6	(5) The recipient must have passed the General Educational
7	Development Test in the calendar year prior to application for the
8	scholarship; and
9	(6)(A) The recipient must have scored in the top ten (10) of all
10	Arkansans who took the General Educational Development Test in the calendar
11	year prior to application for the scholarship, beginning with test-takers in
12	1991, as certified to the Department of Higher Education by the Adult
13	Education Section of the Department of Workforce Education.
14	(B) Provided, however, that the Department of Higher
15	Education is authorized to award a General Educational Development
16	scholarship to an otherwise eligible student who scored in the top twenty-
17	five (25) on the previous calendar year's General Educational Development
18	Test if all test-takers scoring above the applicant on the General
19	Educational Development Test:
20	(i) Have either received a scholarship;
21	(ii) Have not applied by the application deadline;
22	OT
23	(iii) Are otherwise ineligible to receive a
24	scholarship.
25	(c) In no case, however, shall the Department of Higher Education
26	award more than ten (10) scholarships per year.
27	
28	6-82-1104. Amount and duration of scholarship - Funding.
29	(a) Each recipient shall receive a scholarship for one (1) academic
30	year or its equivalent for part-time students, as defined by the Department
31	of Higher Education. The scholarship shall be renewable for up to three (3)
32	academic years, or their equivalent for part-time students, if the recipient
33	meets continuing eligibility criteria established by the department.
34	(b)(1) The amount of the annual scholarship shall be the lesser of one
35	thousand dollars (\$1,000) or the annual tuition charged by the approved
36	institution in which the recipient is enrolled.

1	(2) For part-time students who are recipients, the amount of the
2	annual scholarship shall be prorated on the basis of the number of credit
3	hours enrolled each term such that the recipient receives the maximum
4	equivalent of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) per three (3) credit hours
5	each term up to a maximum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
6	(3) Tuition shall mean the charges defined in § 6-82-1102(4).
7	(c) Scholarships shall be awarded to eligible recipients contingent or
8	the appropriation of funds for this purpose to the department.
9	
10	6-82-1105. Rules and regulations - Review - Certified list.
11	(a) The Department of Higher Education is authorized by this
12	subchapter to develop and promulgate rules and regulations for the
13	administration of this program, consistent with the purposes and requirements
14	of this subchapter.
15	(b) The rules and regulations shall include:
16	(1) Student eligibility criteria based on the provisions of this
17	subchapter;
18	(2) The method for selecting scholarship recipients;
19	(3) Rules for determining continuing eligibility;
20	(4) Procedures for making payment to recipients; and
21	(5) Such other administrative procedures which may be necessary
22	for the implementation and operation of the program.
23	(c) The Director of the Department of Higher Education is authorized
24	to review and evaluate the operation of the program to ensure that the
25	program's operation meets the intent of this legislation.
26	(d) Beginning in 1992, the Adult Education Section of the Department
27	of Workforce Education is directed to provide to the Department of Higher
28	Education by February 1 each year a certified list of the twenty-five (25)
29	top scorers on the General Educational Development Test administered in the
30	previous calendar year.
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32	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-82-1614 is amended to read as follows:
33	6-82-1614. Funding.
34	(a) A Workforce Improvement Grant shall be awarded contingent on the
35	appropriation and availability of funds for the Arkansas Workforce
36	Improvement Grant Program.

1	(b)(1) The total funds available for the program shall be divided
2	among all approved institutions.
3	(2) The funds shall be divided pro rata based on each approved
4	institution's percentage of enrollment of undergraduate students over twenty-
5	five (25) years of age earning credit for the previous academic year.
6	(3) Each institution shall be responsible for administering the
7	program in accordance with rules and regulations as approved by the Arkansas
8	Higher Education Coordinating Board.
9	(c)(1) The department may use funds appropriated for the Second Effort
10	Scholarship Program, § 6-82-1101 et seq., and other available funds to fund
11	the Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Program.
12	(2) Any person who received a scholarship from the Second Effort
13	Scholarship Program, § 6-82-1101 et seq. prior to the repeal of the program
14	in 2005 shall continue to be eligible to receive a Second Effort Scholarship
15	Program, § 6-82-1101 et seq. under the same conditions as were allowed
16	immediately prior to the repeal of the program so long as the person
17	continues to meet the eligibility requirements of the program as it existed
18	immediately prior to its repeal.
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
