34	WHEREAS, Dr. Fay W. Boozman of Rogers, Arkansas, died on Saturday,
35	March 19, 2005, at the age of fifty-eight (58) years; and

1	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman was born on November 10, 1946, in Fort Smith,
2	Arkansas, to Marie Nichols Boozman and Fay Winford Boozman, Jr.; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman attended Tulane University in New Orleans,
5	Louisiana, from 1964 until 1966; attended Hendrix College in Conway,
6	Arkansas, from 1966 until 1967; graduated from the University of Arkansas for
7	Medical Sciences in Little Rock, Arkansas, in 1971 with a medical degree; and
8	received a Master's of Public Health degree from Tulane University in 2002;
9	and
10	
11	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman served in the Arkansas Air National Guard from
12	1971 until 1979; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman and his brother, John Boozman, along with his
15	brother-in-law Mike Malone founded the Boozman Eye Clinic in Rogers,
16	Arkansas, now known as the Boozman-Hof Regional Eye Clinic; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman was elected and served as a state senator
19	representing the Rogers and Springdale, Arkansas, areas from 1995 until 1998;
20	and
21	
22	WHEREAS, those who served with Dr. Boozman in the Senate found him to
23	be a dear and humble person with the purest of motives; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman was appointed Director of the Department of Health
26	in 1999 by Governor Mike Huckabee, who stated that Dr. Boozman "was not only
27	one of the most trusted team members, but he was a close personal friend and
28	Christian brother. One of my happiest days as Governor was when he became
29 30	Director of the Department of Health."; and
31	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman has led the Department of Health through great
32	changes in public health; under his leadership, the agency used new federal
33	funds to begin preparing the state for a bioterrorism attack; and he began
34	changing the focus from providing clinical services to using public campaigns
35	to address health problems, such as tobacco use and obesity; and

1	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman put the state at the forefront in the nation in
2	public health, including his success in prompting the state to spend tobacco-
3	settlement dollars to create a College of Public Health; and

5	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman received the National Governor Association Award
6	for Distinguished Service to State Government, the Arkansas Public Health
7	Association Tom T. Ross Award for Outstanding Service to Public Health, the
8	AIDS Foundation Compassion Award, the Southern Health Association's Charles
9	Jordan Memorial Award for Outstanding Service to Public Health, and the
10	National Public Health Leadership Institute Martha Katz Award; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman was a member of the Church of Pinnacle Hills in
13	Rogers, Arkansas; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, Dr. Boozman is survived by his wife, Vickey Manchaca Boozman;
16	three daughters, Heather Murray and husband Greg of Bedford, Virginia, April
17	Martindale and husband Blake of Rogers, Arkansas, and Robyn Brooks and
18	husband Michael of Rogers, Arkansas; his mother, Marie Boozman of Fort Smith,
19	Arkansas; his brother, U. S. Representative John Boozman and wife Cathy of
20	Rogers, Arkansas; his sister, Debbie Malone and husband Mike of Van Buren,
21	Arkansas; and four grandchildren, Allissa, Taylor, and Blakelyn Martindale,
22	and Catherine Brooks; and
