29	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison was founder and Chairman Emeritus of American
30	Freightways, now FedEx Freight; served on the Board of Directors of FedEx
31	Corporation until September 2003; and was a member of the Board of Directors
32	of Energizer Holdings, Inc.; and

34	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison graduated with honors from Harrison High School
35	at the age of sixteen (16) years in 1951 and earned a Bachelor of Science in
36	Business Administration from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville; and

2	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison's leadership was widely recognized in the
3	business community, and he received numerous awards during his career,
4	including being inducted into the Arkansas Business Hall of Fame in 2002; and

6	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison was active in local and state chambers of
7	commerce, the Arkansas Trucking Association, Arkansas Motor Carriers
8	Association, and Nasstrac, a national transportation trade association; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison was active in civic organizations, including the
11	United Way and the Rotary Club; believed in the value of education and
12	recently contributed an endowed Chair at the University of Arkansas; was a
13	leader in fundraising efforts to build a new complex at Harrison High School,
14	including land for a new football stadium; was a major donor to the Arkansas
15	State Boys Ranch; and was a member of the First Christian Church and the Open
16	Door Sunday School class; and

18	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison was preceded in death by his parents, Pauline
19	Terry and Benjamin Franklin Garrison; his former wife, JoAnn Sugg Garrison;
20	and his son, David Terry Garrison; and

22	WHEREAS, Mr. Garrison is survived by his son and daughter-in-law,
23	Daniel Albert and Julianna Garrison; his son and daughter-in-law, Thomas
24	Robert and Natalie Garrison; his son, William Paul Garrison; three
25	grandchildren, Lisa Rae, Sarah Anne, and David Perry Garrison; his brother,
26	Ben Albert Garrison; and special friend, Paula McLain; and
