22	WHEREAS, John L. Ferguson was raised on a farm near Nashville, Arkansas
23	where he read every history book he could get his hands on; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, John L. Ferguson's love of history led him to pursue a
26	Bachelor of Arts degree in History from Henderson Teachers College, now known
27	as Henderson State University, a Master of Arts degree in History from the
28	University of Arkansas, and a Ph.D. in History from Tulane University; and

30	WHEREAS, after teaching college for several years, Dr. Ferguson was
31	hired as the State Historian for the Arkansas History Commission, a position
32	he has held for more than forty-three (43) years; and

34	WHEREAS, Dr. Ferguson has written many books and articles on Arkansas
35	history for scholars and students, including "Arkansas and the Civil War"
36	(1964), "Historic Arkansas" (1966), which was one of the first textbooks on



Arkansas history for school children, "Arkansas Lives: the Opportunity Land
 Who's Who" (1967), and most recently, "The Church Called County Line" (2002);
 and

5 WHEREAS, as the Director of the Arkansas History Commission, Dr. 6 Ferguson has spearheaded numerous history projects and historic preservation 7 programs, including completion of the first statewide survey of historic 8 structures with staff from the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and federal 9 historic preservation specialist, the establishment of the first historic 10 preservation program in Arkansas, service as Chairman of the Arkansas 11 American Revolution Bicentennial and as a member of the board for the 12 Arkansas Sesquicentennial, and establishment of a Conservation Lab within the 13 Arkansas History Commission to preserve priceless Arkansas historical 14 materials; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Ferguson not only has dedicated himself to preserving and interpreting Arkansas history through the Arkansas History Commission, but also has donated many of his family's historical belongings, including wagons, furniture, farm equipment, and salt kettles, to museums throughout the state, including museums in Dumas, Arkansas Post, and Stuttgart, 21
