14	CELEBRATING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY AS
15	"BLACK HISTORY MONTH".

18	WHEREAS, throughout the history of America, truly significant African-
19	American contributions to the economy, military, social growth, sciences, and
20	arts of this great nation have all too often been ignored; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, in recognition of this oversight, Americans began recognizing
23	"Black History Month", the successor of Negro History Week, annually in 1926;
24	and

26 27	WHEREAS, the celebration of Black History Month and the study of
27	African-American history is part of the legacy of Dr. Carter G. Woodson; and
28	LHEDEAS the presence of African Americans in the nation and in the
29 30	WHEREAS, the progress of African-Americans in the nation and in the State of Arkansas has been marked with the tragedy of social inequalities and
31	the triumph of group achievements; and
32	the triumph or group achievements, and
33	WHEREAS, although African-Americans have participated in every major
34	United States war, the battle for integration and for recognition of the
35	accomplishments of African-American soldiers has been a slow process; and
36	accompliancing of inflican implican solutions has been a slow process, and

1	WHEREAS, not until after World War II did the United States Armed
2	Forces become integrated under a 1948 executive order by President Harry S.
3	Truman; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, "Black History Month" celebrates the influence of African-
6	American culture in the arts and entertainment; the development of African-
7	Americans politically and economically; the progression of African-Americans
8	socially and academically; the diversity within the African-American culture
9	that adds to its richness; and the cultural evolution of African-Americans
10	from the beginning of the slave trade through the civil rights movement to
11	the present; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, in the words of Carter Woodson on the founding of Negro
14	History Week in 1926, "We should emphasize not Negro history, but the Negro
15	in history. What we need is not a history of selected races or nations but
16	the history of the world void of national bias, race hate, and religious
17	prejudice",
18	
19	NOW THEREFORE,
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
21	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:
22	
23	THAT the Senate of the State of Arkansas, the House concurring therein
24	proclaims February as "Black History Month", and recognizes and applauds the
25	sacrifices and myriad contributions made by African-American men and women
26	throughout this great state's and nation's history.
