19	HONORING THE ONE HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY
20	OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL.

23	WHEREAS, Rotary International, celebrating its $100^{ m th}$ anniversary on
24	February 23, 2005, consists of 1.2 million members in some 31,000 Rotary
25	Clubs in 166 countries, all committed to addressing problems such as
26	environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger, children at risk, and
27	the environment; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, Rotary clubs also support programs for youth, educational
30	opportunities and international exchanges for students, teachers, and other
31	professionals, and vocational and career development; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, the main objective of Rotary Clubs is service — in the
34	community, in the workplace, and throughout the world $-$ and the clubs
35	represent a cross-section of the community's business and professional men
36	and women; and

2	WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Chicago was founded on February 23, 1905,
3	when Chicago attorney Paul Harris invited three business associates to a
4	meeting to form a club to share "mutual cooperation and informal friendship
5	such as all of us had once known in our villages"; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, by 1921, Rotary Clubs had been formed on six continents, and
8	the name Rotary International was adopted in 1922; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, as Rotary International grew, its focus changed from serving
11	the business and professional needs of its members to serving communities in
12	need, as expressed by its motto: "Service Above Self"; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, the Rotary Foundation, established in 1928, today garners
15	contributions exceeding \$80 million annually to support a range of
16	humanitarian grants and educational programs; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, in 1985, Rotary International made a commitment to immunize
19	all of the world's children against polio, and by the centennial anniversary
20	of Rotary in 2005, more than \$500 million will have been committed to the
21	eradication of polio,
22	
23	NOW THEREFORE,
24	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
25	STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

27	THAT the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Fifth
28	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas congratulate Rotary International
29	on its one hundred years of service to communities throughout the world.
