28	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Aging Initiative, a program of the University of	
29	Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Donald W. Reynolds Institute on Aging,	
30	was started to plan and implement specialized geriatric health care and	
31	education programs; and

33	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Aging Initiative intends to have specialized	
34	geriatric health care services within fifty (50) miles of each senior

1	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Aging Initiative designed, funded, and
2	strategically located Centers on Aging in Springdale, Bella Vista, Harrison,
3	Mountain Home, Jonesboro, Fort Smith, West Memphis, Helena, Pine Bluff, El
4	Dorado, and Texarkana; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, these centers are known as the Schmieding Center for Senior
7	Health and Education, Springdale; Center on Aging Northeast, Jonesboro; West
8	Central Arkansas Center on Aging, Fort Smith; Delta Center on Aging, West
9	Memphis, and Helena; South Central Center on Aging, Pine Bluff; South
10	Arkansas Center on Aging, El Dorado; and Texarkana Regional Center on Aging,
11	Texarkana; and
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13	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Aging Initiative showed ingenuity and creativity
14	by leveraging the original appropriation of \$2,100,000 into several million
15	dollars from private sources, foundations, and grants; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, the Arkansas Aging Initiative formed partnerships with local
18	and regional hospitals to create senior health centers and clinics staffed by
19	professional geriatricians to meet the unique health care needs of the
20	elderly,

22	NOW THEREFORE,
23	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
24	STATE OF ARKANSAS:

26	That the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas
27	recognizes and commends Dr. Claudia Beverly and the Arkansas Aging Initiative
28	Leadership Team for their efforts in designing, implementing, and operating
29	the comprehensive program of specialized geriatric health services for our
30	senior citizens and their families.

32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Eighty-fifth General Assembly of the
33	State of Arkansas commends the participating hospital administrators,
34	geriatricians, nurses and other members of the health professional teams
