17	WHEREAS, renowned human and civil rights activist, Daisy Lee Gatson
18	Bates was born in Huttig, Arkansas on November 11, 1914; and

20	WHEREAS, in 1941, Ms. Bates, along with her husband, L. C. Bates,
21	established the most influential African-American newspaper in the civil
22	rights movement in Arkansas, the "Arkansas State Press"; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, in 1952, Ms. Bates was elected the first woman president of
25	the Arkansas Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of
26	Colored People; and
27 20	WEREAS in 1057 Ma Patag became the advisor to the female "Little
28 29	WHEREAS, in 1957, Ms. Bates became the advisor to the famous "Little Rock Nine", the first group of African-American students to integrate
29 30	Arkansas' public schools, to implement the Little Rock School Board's
31	desegregation plan at Central High School; and
32	desegregation plan at General nigh School, and
33	WHEREAS, in 1962, Ms. Bates published her memoirs of the Central High
34	School crisis entitled, "The Long Shadow of Little Rock", containing an
35	introduction by Eleanor Roosevelt; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Bates received many awards and honors both locally and nationally. In May of 1984, she was awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws degree by the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville; and WHEREAS, 14th Street in Little Rock, Arkansas has been renamed Daisy L. Gatson Bates Drive in honor of Ms. Bates' achievements; and WHEREAS, on November 4, 1999, Ms. Bates died and was buried at the Haven of Rest Cemetery in Little Rock, Arkansas; and WHEREAS, in 2001, the General Assembly designated the third Monday in February as Daisy Gatson Bates Day; and WHEREAS, Ms. Daisy Lee Gatson Bates should continue to be honored by the State of Arkansas for her historic renown as a civil rights leader and for her distinguished civic services, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the Senate of the Eighty-Fifth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas honors the memory of the late Ms. Daisy Lee Gatson Bates and celebrates her life and achievements this 21st day of February, 2005, Daisy Gatson Bates Day.
