10	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
11	General Assembly that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas requires the			
12	state to provide a general, suitable, and efficient system of public			
13	education for students; that the Arkansas Supreme Court has found that the			
14	public school system in Arkansas is inadequate; that course offerings that			
15	meet curriculum requirements are important for each student's academic			
16	success; and that this act is immediately necessary to allow school districts			
17	more flexibility to meet the curriculum standards by utilizing technology and			
18	other delivery methods so that all children have access to the courses of			
19	study they need for an adequate education. Therefore, an emergency is			
20	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the			
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective			
22	<u>on:</u>			
23	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
24	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
25	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
26	bill; or			
27	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
28	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
