36	(a) The General Assembly has determined that the	State Board of	

- 1 Education, the Department of Education, public schools, counties, and
- 2 municipalities shall examine methods, policies, rules, and practices to
- 3 determine whether:
- 4 (1) Improvements may be made to limit the use of public school
- 5 <u>funds to provide services or maintain operations that are not directly</u>
- 6 related to educating children in public schools; and
- 7 (2) Additional sources of revenue other than public school funds
- 8 can be found to provide services or maintain operations that are not directly
- 9 related to educating children in public schools.
- 10 (b) Beginning October 1, 2006, and each subsequent year thereafter,
- 11 the Department of Education shall report the findings under this section to
- 12 <u>the Senate Interim Committee on Education and the House Interim Committee on</u>
- 13 Education.

- 15 SECTION 2. Uncodified Section 7 of Act 2090 of 2005 is amended to read 16 as follows:
- 17 SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR 18 PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND TRANSFER.
- 19 (a) To provide funding for the appropriations authorized herein, the
- 20 Director of the Assessment Coordination Department of the State of Arkansas
- 21 shall certify monthly to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the amount of
- 22 funding needed each month to pay counties and professional reappraisal
- 23 companies for the reappraisal of real property as required by law.
- 24 (b) Upon receipt of such certification the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
- 25 State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer \underline{as}
- 26 follows:
- 27 (1) Beginning July 1, 2005, through December 30, 2006, seventy-
- 28 six percent 76% (76%) of the amounts certified by the Assessment Coordination
- 29 Department from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account,
- 30 sixteen percent 16% (16%) of the amount certified from the County Aid Fund,
- 31 and eight percent 8% (8%) of the amount certified from the Municipal Aid Fund
- 32 to the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund.
- 33 (2)(A)(i) The funds attributable to sales and use taxes levied
- 34 prior to August 1, 2006, shall not be transferred from the Property Tax
- 35 Relief Trust Fund to the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund or the
- 36 <u>Reappraisal Finance Fund.</u>

1	(ii) On December 31, 2006, the Chief Fiscal Officer
2	shall transfer on his books from the amounts certified from the remaining
3	excess funds calculated under Arkansas Code § 26-26-310(b)(2)(C)(i) of the
4	Property Tax Relief Trust Fund the sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand
5	Dollars (\$7,500,000) to the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund, § 19-5-
6	1096, and Six Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$6,750,000) to
7	the Reappraisal Finance Fund.
8	(B) If insufficient funds are available in the Property
9	Tax Relief Trust Fund to fully fund the monthly amounts certified by the
10	Assessment Coordination Department, then the Chief Fiscal Officer shall
11	transfer on his books the amount needed each month to fully fund the monthly
12	amounts certified by the Assessment Coordination Department to the Arkansas
13	Real Property Reappraisal Fund as follows:
14	(i) Seventy-six percent (76%) of the amounts
15	certified from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account;
16	(ii) Sixteen percent (16%) of the amount certified
17	from the County Aid Fund; and
18	(iii) Eight percent (8%) of the amount certified
19	from the Municipal Aid Fund.
20	(c) In no event shall the total amount of funds transferred as
21	authorized herein disbursed from the Arkansas Real Property Reappraisal Fund
22	exceed fourteen million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$14,250,000)
23	during each year of the 2005-07 biennium.
24	(d) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July
25	1, 2005, through June 30, 2007.

27	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 12 is amended
28	to add an additional section to read as follows:
29	19-5-1230. Reappraisal Finance Fund.
30	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor
31	of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
32	"Reappraisal Finance Fund".
33	(b) The fund shall consist of revenues as may be authorized by law.
34	(c) The fund shall be used by the Assessment Coordination Department
35	to fund mandated county-wide reappraisals as provided by law.
36	

1	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court	
3	found that the public school funding system continues to be inadequate and	
4	the public schools are operating under a constitutional infirmity which must	
5	be corrected immediately; that to correct the constitutional infirmity and to	
6	provide adequate funding for public education, the amount of funding provided	
7	to school districts must be examined; and that this act is immediately	
8	necessary to allow the Department of Education, the State Board of Education,	
9	public schools, and counties to examine the methods, policies, rules, and	
10	practices to determine whether public school funds are being used to provide	
11	services or maintain operations that are not directly related to educating	
12	children in public schools, examine other sources of funding for these	
13	services or operations, and report their findings to the General Assembly.	
14	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately	
15	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall	
16	become effective on:	
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the	
20	<pre>bill; or</pre>	
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
