23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25 26	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - ANTIVIRAL STOCKPILE PROGRAM. There is hereby
27	appropriated, to the Department of Health and Human Services - Division of
28	Health, to be payable from the Public Health Fund, for procuring an antiviral
29	stockpile and associated costs of an influenza pandemic or other public
30	health emergency, for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the sum of
31	\$6,000,000.
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33	SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL, AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
35	TRANSFER. On the effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
36	State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the

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     State Auditor the sum of six million dollars ($6,000,000) from the
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     unobligated funds in the General Improvement Fund to the Public Health Fund.
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        SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
     CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL, AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
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     FORWARD. The funds transferred under the provisions of Section 2 of this Act
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     shall be carried forward and made available for the same purpose for the
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     fiscal year ending June 30, 2007.
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        SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
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     by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
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     made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
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     restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
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     Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
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     Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
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     control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
     the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
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     strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
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        SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
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     that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
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     in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
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     was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
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     and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
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     the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
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     testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
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     Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
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        SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
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     Assembly, that potential health emergencies facing this state may require an
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     antiviral stockpile to combat an influenza pandemic or other public health
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     emergency and that the Department of Health and Human Services - Division of
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     Health is in dire need of additional resources to provide these services.
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     Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
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     necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
     safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by the Governor.
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     If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
     effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
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     may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
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     overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
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     the veto.
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
