18	WHEREAS, Richard B. Atkinson, Dean and Professor of the University of
19	Arkansas School of Law in Fayetteville, Arkansas, passed away at the age of
20	fifty-eight (58) on August 4, 2005, while attending the American Bar
21	Association annual meeting; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, Professor Atkinson was known by many as a man of integrity,
24	sincerity, humor, and compassion; had a passion for the law and teaching; and
25	appreciated and admired the arts and antiquities; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, Professor Atkinson graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a bachelor of
28	arts degree from Duke University; received a master's degree in divinity and
29	a juris doctorate from Yale University; became an associate with the law firm
30	of King and Spalding in Atlanta, Georgia; and was a visiting professor at the
31	University of North Carolina, Emory University, and Georgia State University;

33 34	WHEDEAS Professor Atkinson was recomited to the University of Automate
34 35	WHEREAS, Professor Atkinson was recruited to the University of Arkansas by his law school classmate and later President Bill Clinton, who remarked of
35 36	his friend, "Richard always lived as he believed, that we could always be
50	nis illend, kichard always lived as he belleved, that we could always be

2	
3	WHEREAS, as a professor of law at the University of Arkansas School of
4	Law, he maintained high expectations and an abiding personal interest in each
5	of his students; was Chair of the Faculty Appointments Committee; gave bar
6	review lectures around the nation; received state committee appointments by
7	the Governor of Arkansas, including service as chair of the Workers'
8	Compensation Reform Commission; and served as interim dean for the 1990-91
9	academic year; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, on January 6, 2003, Professor Atkinson became the 10th Dean of
12	the University of Arkansas School of Law, a position in which he excelled as
13	a leader at fundraising, planning for new facilities, encouraging students,
14	and supporting the staff and faculty; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, under Dean Atkinson's leadership, the School of Law was
17	included among the "most diverse law schools in the country" by the 2006 U.S.
18	News and World Report's "America's Best Graduate Schools" and ranked No. 12
19	in the specialized category of "Legal Writing"; was ranked in 2004 by The
20	National Jurist magazine among a select group of public law schools it
21	regarded as a "Very Good Value"; and was ranked 13th out of 172 in the nation
22	in success in improving gender and ethic diversity over the 10-year period
23	from 1993-2003, as reported by The National Jurist; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, Dean Atkinson was a member and served three (3) terms as Chair
26	of the Board of Directors of the Washington Regional Medical Center; was a
27	founding board member of the Washington Regional Medical Foundation; and was
28	a founding board member of the Northwest Arkansas Radiation Therapy
29	Institute; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, Dean Atkinson is survived by his partner Michael Hollomon,
32	Director of Psychiatric Services at Washington Regional Medical Center in
33	Fayetteville; John Atkinson and his wife Lee of Greensboro, North Carolina;
34	Paul Atkinson and his wife Scarlett of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina; his
35	nieces and nephews Sarah Atkinson and her husband Grant Gosch of Asheville,
36	North Carolina: David Atkinson of Charleston, South Carolina: Lauren Atkinson

1	of Greensboro, North Carolina; Jeremy Martin, his wife Stacey, and their son
2	Jaxon of Chapin, South Carolina; Jason Martin of West Columbia, South
3	Carolina; his aunt Betty Duffield and his cousin Susie Bleich, both of
4	Fayetteville; and a host of other cousins around the country; and

6	WHEREAS, the Senate of the Eighty-Fifth General Assembly of the State
7	of Arkansas recognizes Richard Atkinson's life and achievements and mourns
8	his passing,
9	
10	NOW THEREFORE,
11	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
12	STATE OF ARKANSAS:

14	THAT the Senate honors the memory of Richard Atkinson, celebrates his
15	life and significant contributions to the Arkansas Bar, academia, and public
16	service, and remembers him with the deepest admiration and respect for his
17	personal warmth, dedication, decency, humor, and consideration for others.
