## For An Act To Be Entitled

an act to increase academic instruction time in PUBLIC SCHOOLS; TO LIMIT PHYSICAL ACTIVITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-16-132(b)(1), concerning the physical education curriculum requirement for public schools, is amended to read as follows:
(b)(1)(A) Every kindergarten through grade eight (K-8) public educational institution in this state shall require no less than a total of one (1) hour per week of physical education training and instruction for every student who is physically fit and able to participate.
(B) In grades nine through twelve (9-12) no public school student may be required to take physical education instruction in excess of the physical education requirement mandated for graduation from an Arkansas public high school.
(C) No public school student may be required to participate in physical activity in grades kindergarten through twelve ( $K-12$ ) in excess of the curriculum requirement for physical education in this section.

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-16-132, concerning the physical education curriculum requirement for public schools, is amended to add an additional subsection to read as follows:
(g) The State Board of Education shall submit to the House Interim Committee on Education and the Senate Interim Committee on Education for the committees' review any proposed rules regarding physical education or physical activity standards for grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) developed pursuant to this section that exceed the maximums identified in subdivision (b)(l) of this section.

SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-7-135(f), concerning the nutrition and physical education standards for public school children, is amended to read as follows:
(f)(l) The Department of Education and the division shall report annually on progress in implementing nutrition and physical education standards to the chairs of the House Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor and the Senate Interim Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, the House Interim Committee on Education, and the Senate Interim Committee on Education.
(2) The State Board of Education shall submit to the House Interim Committee on Education and the Senate Interim Committee on Education for the committees' review any proposed rules regarding physical education or physical activity standards for grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) developed pursuant to this section.
