19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-6-203(a) and (b), concerning campaign
22 contributions, are amended to read as follows:

23 (a)(1)(A) It shall be unlawful for any candidate for any public
24 office, except the office of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of
25 State, Treasurer of State, Auditor of State, Attorney General, and
26 Commissioner of State Lands, or for any person acting on the candidate's
27 behalf to accept campaign contributions in excess of two thousand dollars
28 (\$2,000) per election from any person.

29 (B)(i) A candidate may accept a campaign contribution or
30 contributions up to the maximum amount from any ~~prospective contributor~~
31 person for each election, whether opposed or unopposed.

32 (ii) Two (2) or more corporations sharing the same
33 majority owner shall be considered a single person for the purpose of making
34 a contribution or contributions to a candidate for each election, whether
35 opposed or unopposed.

36 (2)(A) It shall be unlawful for any candidate for the office of



1 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer of State,
 2 Auditor of State, Attorney General, and Commissioner of State Lands, or for
 3 any person acting on the candidate's behalf to accept campaign contributions
 4 in excess of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per election from any person.

5 (B)(i) A candidate may accept a campaign contribution or
 6 contributions up to the maximum amount from any ~~prospective contributor~~
 7 person for each election, whether opposed or unopposed.

8 (ii) Two (2) or more corporations sharing the same
 9 majority owner shall be considered a single person for the purpose of making
 10 a contribution or contributions to a candidate for each election, whether
 11 opposed or unopposed.

12 (b)(1)(A) It shall be unlawful for any person to make a contribution
