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1	WHEREAS, because cyberbullying has the potential for instantaneous		
2	distribution to a wide audience, it can impact the educational environment b		
3	rapidly reaching a large number of students and public school employees, and		
4	creating an environment of fear and intimidation that materially or		
5	substantially disrupts class work and discipline in a public school,		
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7	NOW THEREFORE,		
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

10	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code $\S$ 6-18-514(a) and (b)(1) and (2) regarding		
11	public school district antibullying policies, are amended to read as follows:		
12	(a)(1) The school board of directors in every public school district		
13	shall adopt policies to prevent pupil harassment, also known as bullying.		
14	(2) As used in this subchapter:		
15	(A) "Bullying" means the intentional harassment,		
16	intimidation, humiliation, ridicule, defamation, or threat or incitement of		
17	violence against a student or public school employee by a written, verbal,		
18	electronic, or physical act that causes or seriously threatens to cause:		
19	(i) Physical harm to a public school employee or		
20	student or damage to the public school employee's or student's property;		
21	(ii) Substantial interference with a student's		
22	education or with a public school employee's role in education;		
23	(iii) An intimidating or threatening educational		
24	environment for one (1) or more students or public school employees due to		
25	the severity, persistence, or pervasiveness of the act; or		
26	(iv) Substantial disruption of the orderly operation		
27	of the school or educational environment;		
28	(B) "Electronic act" means without limitation a		
29	communication or image transmitted by means of an electronic device,		
30	including without limitation a telephone, wireless phone or other wireless		
31	communications device, computer, or pager; and		
32	(C) "Substantial disruption" means without limitation that any		
33	one or more of the following occur as a result of the bullying:		
34	(i) Cessation of instruction or educational activities;		
35	(ii) Interruption of classroom instruction or educational		
36	activities by educational staff for purposes of discussing or handling issues		

1	related to the bullying;
2	(iii) Inability of students or educational staff to focus
3	on learning or function as an educational unit because of feeling fearful or
4	threatened;
5	(iv) Severe or repetitive disciplinary measures are needed
6	in the classroom or during educational activities; or
7	(v) Exhibition of other behaviors by students or
8	educational staff that are increasingly disruptive to the learning

10	(b) The policies shall:
11	(1)(A) Clearly define conduct that constitutes bullying.
12	(B) The definition shall include without limitation
13	the definition contained in subsection (a) of this section;
14	(2) Prohibit bullying:
15	(A) while While in school, on school equipment or
16	property, in school vehicles, on school buses, at designated school bus
17	stops, at school-sponsored activities, $\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}}{\partial t}$ at school-sanctioned events; $\underline{\mathbf{or}}$
18	(B) By an electronic act, wherever originated, that
