34	(e)(f) Whenever a <u>nonjudicial</u> punishment of forfeiture <u>of an amount</u> of		
35	base pay and allowance is imposed under this section, the forfeiture may		
36	apply to the base pay only and or allowances before any deduction,		

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- withholding, assignment, or forfeiture then due or becoming due on or after the date that punishment is imposed and to any pay and allowances accrued before that date.

 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 12-64-609 is amended to read as follows:

 12-64-609. Fines and forfeitures.
- 7 (a) Fines may be paid to a military court or to an officer executing 8 its process.
- 9 (b)(1) The amount of a fine may be noted upon any state roll or 10 account for pay of the delinquent and deducted from any pay or allowance due 11 or thereafter to become due him, until the fine is liquidated.
 - (2) Any sum so deducted shall be turned in to the military court which imposed the fine and shall be paid over by the officer receiving it in like manner as provided for other fines and moneys collected under a sentence of a summary court-martial.
- 16 (c)(1) Notwithstanding any other law, a fine or penalty imposed by a
 17 military court upon an officer or enlistee shall be paid by the officer
 18 collecting it within thirty (30) days to the Treasurer of the State of
 19 Arkansas and shall become a part of, be credited to, and be spent from, the
 20 State Military Department Fund.
 - (2) The Treasurer of the State shall then report the amount thereof to the Adjutant General of the State and shall pay it over in appropriate warrant.
 - (d) If a punishment of fine or forfeiture of an amount of base pay and allowance is imposed by a court-martial, the amount of the fine or forfeiture shall apply to any type or category of pay and allowances then due or becoming due on or after the date that the punishment is imposed before any deduction, withholding, assignment, previous forfeiture, or collection from the pay and allowances, and to any pay and allowances accrued before that date.

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32 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 12-64-844 is amended to read as follows:

33 12-64-844. General article - Offenses cognizable by courts-martial.

(a) Though not specifically mentioned in this code, all disorders and neglects to the prejudice of good order and discipline in the organized militia, all conduct of a nature to bring discredit upon the organized

1 militia, and crimes and offenses not capital, of which persons subject to 2 this code may be guilty, shall be taken cognizance of by a general, special, or summary court-martial, according to the nature and degree of the offense, 3 4 and shall be punished at the discretion of that court. 5 (b) However, cognizance may not be taken and jurisdiction may not be 6 extended to the crimes of murder, manslaughter, rape, larceny and wrongful 7 appropriation for value of over thirty five dollars (\$35.00), robbery, 8 maiming, sodomy, arson, extortion, burglary, or housebreaking, jurisdiction 9 of which is reserved to civil courts. 10 11 SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 12-64-403 is amended to read as follows: 12 12-64-403. Jurisdiction of general courts-martial. Subject to § 12-64-402, general courts-martial have jurisdiction to try 13 14 persons subject to this code for any offense made punishable by this code and 15 may, under such limitations as the Governor may prescribe, adjudge any of the 16 following punishments: 17 (1) A fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) or forfeiture of pay and allowances of not more than five hundred dollars 18 (\$500); A fine or forfeiture in an amount that shall not exceed two hundred 19 20 (200) days of the service member's base pay and allowances; 21 (2) Confinement with hard labor for not more than two hundred 22 (200) days; 23 (3) Dishonorable discharge, bad conduct discharge, or dismissal; 24 (4) Reprimand; 25 (5) Reduction of enlisted persons to a lower grade; or 26 (6) Any combination of these punishments. 27 28 SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 12-64-404(b), regarding the jurisdiction of special courts-martial, is amended to read as follows: 29 30 (b) A special court-martial may adjudge any punishment that a general court-martial may adjudge, except for the following punishments: 31 32 (1) dishonorable Dishonorable discharge; 33 (2) dismissal, Dismissal; or 34 (3) confinement Confinement with hard labor for more than one 35 hundred (100) days; or 36 (4) A fine or forfeiture of pay and allowances in an amount that

1	exceeds one hundred (100) days of the service member's base pay and		
2	allowances of more than two hundred dollars (\$200), or a fine of more than		
3	two hundred dollars (\$200).		
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5	SECTION 10. Arkansas Code § 12-64-405(c), regarding jurisdiction of		
6	summary courts-martial, is amended to read as follows:		
7	(c) Summary courts-martial may adjudge any of the following		
8	punishments:		
9	(1) Confinement with hard labor for not exceeding twenty-five		
10	days;		
11	(2) A fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100) or		
12	forfeiture of pay and allowances in an amount that shall not exceed one		
13	hundred (100) days of the service member's base pay and allowances; or		
14	(3) Forfeiture of pay and allowances of not more than one		
15	hundred dollars (\$100);		
16	(4)(3) Reprimand;		
17	(5)(4) Reduction of enlisted persons to a lower grade; and or

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20	SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
21	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there are many members of the		
22	Arkansas National Guard and Reserves that are serving in active duty in Iraq		
23	and Afghanistan in the war on terror; that it is critical that Arkansas law		
24	be updated and be consistent with federal law and rules; and that this act is		
25	necessary to eliminate confusion regarding out-dated and inconsistent		
26	provisions in the Military Code of Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is		
27	declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the		
28	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
29	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
30	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
31	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
32	bill; or		
33	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
34	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
