16	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
17	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Commission on Eye		
18	and Vision Care of School Age Children expires at the end of the current		
19	state fiscal year; that the commission serves a critical function in ensuring		
20	that all Arkansas school children, especially those with eye and vision		
21	problems, have an equal opportunity to access the learning opportunities		
22	available through a public school education; and that this act is immediately		
23	necessary because any delay in the effective date of this act would work		
24	irreparable harm on the ability of the commission to carry out its
