20 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 21 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Commission on Eye 22 and Vision Care of School Age Children expires at the end of the current 23 state fiscal year; that the commission serves a critical function in ensuring that all Arkansas school children, especially those with eye and vision 24 problems, have an equal opportunity to access the learning opportunities 25 26 available through a public school education; and that this act is immediately 27 necessary because any delay in the effective date of this act would work 28 irreparable harm on the ability of the commission to carry out its 29 responsibilities in service to Arkansas' public school system. Therefore, an 30 emergency is declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the 31 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective 32 on: 33 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 34 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 35 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
