5	(iv) Proof of liability insurance for the tow		
6	vehicle shall be submitted to the Arkansas Highway Police Division of the		
7	Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department;		
8	(v) Vehicles shall be accompanied by a front escort		
9	vehicle with flashing amber lights, radio contact with the vehicle operator,		
10	and "wide load" signs;		
11	(vi)(a) Vehicles may be moved in convoys of no more		
12	than three (3) vehicles with escorts at the front and rear of the convoy.		
13	(b) Convoys shall pull off the highway at		
14	sufficient intervals to allow traffic to pass; and		
15	(vii) Permit fees shall be set by the State Highway		
16	Commission.
