25	This chapter shall be l	known and may be cited as	s the "Arkansas
26	Orthotics, Prosthetics, and	Pedorthics Practice Act	of 2007".
27			
28	17-107-102. Purpose.		
29	Since the professions	related to orthotics, pro	osthetics, and pedorthics
30	significantly affect the live	es of the people of this	state, it is the purpose
31	of this chapter to protect re	esources available to the	e Arkansas Medicaid
32	Program and the public in gen	neral by setting standar	ds of qualification,
33	training, and experience for	those who represent the	mselves to the public as
34	orthotists, prosthetists, and	d pedorthists and by pro	moting high standards of
35	professional performance for	those engaged in the pra	actice of orthotics,
36	prosthetics, and pedorthics.

2	17-107-103. Definitions.
3	As used in this chapter:
4	(1)(A) "Orthosis" means an external device that is:
5	(i) Intended to restore physiological function or
6	cosmesis to a patient; and
7	(ii) Custom-designed, fabricated, assembled, fitted,
8	or adjusted for the patient using the device prior to or concurrent with the
9	delivery of the device to the patient.
10	(B) "Orthosis" does not include a cane, crutch, corset,
11	dental appliance, elastic hose, elastic support, fabric support, generic arch
12	support, low-temperature plastic splint, soft cervical collar, truss, or
13	other similar device that:
14	(i) Is carried in stock and sold without therapeutic
15	modification by a corset shop, department store, drug store, surgical supply
16	facility, or similar retail entity; and
17	(ii) Has no significant impact on the neuromuscular,
18	musculoskeletal, or neuromusculoskeletal functions of the body;
19	(2) "Orthotic assistant" means an individual who is licensed
20	under this chapter to assist an orthotist or an orthotist/prosthetist with
21	patient care services and fabrication of orthoses under the supervision of an
22	orthotist or an orthotist/prosthetist;
23	(3) "Orthotic education program" means a course of instruction
24	in orthotics:
25	(A) Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of
26	Allied Health Education Programs; and
27	(B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
28	Pedorthics Licensing Board;
29	(4) "Orthotic resident" means an individual who has completed an
30	orthotic education program and is continuing his or her clinical education in
31	an orthotic residency program:
32	(A) Accredited by the National Commission on Orthotic and
33	Prosthetic Education; and
34	(B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and

36	(5) "Orthotics" means the science and practice of providing or

1	managing the provision of an orthosis based on clinical assessment, technical
2	judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized by law to
3	write an order for an orthosis;
4	(6) "Orthotist" means an individual who is licensed under this
5	chapter to practice orthotics and pedorthics;
6	(7) "Orthotic/prosthetic assistant" means an individual who is
7	licensed under this chapter to assist both an orthotist and a prosthetist
8	with patient care services and fabrication of prostheses, orthoses, or
9	pedorthic devices under the supervision of an orthotist, an
10	orthotist/prosthetist, or a prosthetist as appropriate; and
11	(8) "Orthotist/prosthetist" means an individual who is licensed
12	to practice orthotics, pedorthics, and prosthetics;
13	(9)(A) "Pedorthic device" means therapeutic footwear, foot
14	orthoses for use at the ankle or below, or footwear modified for therapeutic
15	purposes as ordered by a licensed health care practitioner authorized by law
16	to write an order for a pedorthic device.
17	(B) "Pedorthic device" does not include:
18	(i) Nontherapeutic accommodative inlays or
19	nontherapeutic accommodative footwear regardless of method of manufacture;
20	(ii) Shoes modified or made for nontherapeutic
21	purposes;
22	(iii) Unmodified shoes; or
23	(iv) Prefabricated foot care products;
24	(10) "Pedorthic education program" means a course of instruction
25	in pedorthics:
26	(A) Accredited by the Board for Certification in
27	Pedorthics, Inc.; and
28	(B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
29	Pedorthics Licensing Board;
30	(11) "Pedorthics" means the science and practice of providing or
31	managing the provision of a pedorthic device based on clinical assessment,
32	technical judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized
33	by law to write an order for a pedorthic device;
34	(12) "Pedorthist" means an individual who is licensed under this
35	chapter to practice pedorthics;
36	(13)(A) "Prefabricated device" means a mass-produced device

1	that:
2	(i) Is prepackaged, carried in stock, and sold off
3	the shelf or over the counter by a corset shop, department store, drug store,
4	surgical supply facility, or similar retail entity; and
5	(ii) Does not require clinical assessment, technical
6	judgment, or therapeutic modification for appropriate use by the customer.
7	(B) "Prefabricated device" may include a cane, a crutch, a
8	corset, a dental appliance, an elastic hose, an elastic support, a fabric
9	support, a generic arch support, a low-temperature plastic splint, a soft
10	cervical collar, a truss, or other similar device;
11	(14)(A) "Prosthesis" means an external device that is:
12	(i) Intended to replace an absent external body part
13	for the purpose of restoring physiological function or cosmesis to a patient;
14	<u>and</u>
15	(ii) Custom-designed, fabricated, assembled, fitted,
16	or adjusted for the patient using the device prior to or concurrent with
17	being delivered to the patient;
18	(B) "Prosthesis" does not include an artificial eye, an
19	artificial ear, a dental appliance, a cosmetic device, such as artificial
20	eyelashes or wigs, an artificial facial device, or other device that does not
21	have a significant impact on the neuromuscular, musculoskeletal, or
22	neuromusculoskeletal functions of the body;
23	(15) "Prosthetic assistant" means an individual who is licensed
24	under this chapter to assist a prosthetist or orthotist/prosthetist with
25	patient care services and fabrication of prostheses under the supervision of
26	a prosthetist or an orthotist/prosthetist; and
27	(16) "Prosthetic education program" means a course of
28	instruction in prosthetics:
29	(A) Accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of
30	Allied Health Education Programs; and
31	(B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
32	Pedorthics Licensing Board;
33	(17) "Prosthetic resident" means an individual who has completed
34	a prosthetic education program and is continuing his or her clinical
35	education in a prosthetic residency program:
36	(A) Accredited by the National Commission on Orthotic and

1	Prosthetic Education; and
2	(B) Approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
3	Pedorthics Licensing Board;
4	(18) "Prosthetics" means the science and practice of providing
5	or managing the provision of a prosthesis based on clinical assessment,
6	technical judgment, and an order from a health care practitioner authorized
7	to write an order for a prosthesis; and
8	(19) "Prosthetist" means an individual who is licensed under
9	this chapter to practice prosthetics.
10	
11	17-107-104. Exemptions.
12	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to restrict:
13	(1) The practice of orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics by:
14	(A) An individual who is employed by the federal government
15	or any bureau, division, or agency of the federal government while in the
16	discharge of the employee's official duties;
17	(B) A student enrolled in an orthotic education program,
18	prosthetic education program, or pedorthic education program;
19	(C) An orthotic resident or prosthetic resident; or
20	(D) A student participating in a pedorthic work experience
21	program or internship approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
22	Pedorthics Licensing Board;
23	(2) A licensed health care practitioner from engaging in the
24	full scope of practice of the practitioner's profession or from doing work
25	within the standards and ethics of his or her respective professions;
26	(3) An individual from sizing a prefabricated device, including
27	without limitation, diabetic shoes and similar devices, for a customer if the
28	individual:
29	(A) Is acting under the supervision and control of a
30	pharmacist or pharmacy licensed under § 17-92-101 et seq.;
31	(B) Does not cast, measure, mold, or scan a part of the
32	human body for the purpose of constructing an external device intended to
33	treat a customer's medical condition; and
34	(C) Can provide satisfactory evidence of one (1) of the
35	<pre>following:</pre>
36	(i) The individual has documentation of training

1	from an orthotist, a prosthetist, a pedorthist, or a manufacturer approved by
2	the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board;
3	(ii) The individual is certified or registered as an
4	orthotic fitter or a pedorthic fitter by a nationally recognized board or
5	association approved by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics
6	Licensing Board; or
7	(iii) The individual works under the direct
8	supervision of an orthotic fitter or pedorthic fitter who is certified or
9	registered by a nationally recognized board or association approved by the
10	Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board; and
11	(4) A licensed health care practitioner from dispensing or
12	selling a prefabricated device based on an image of the patient's limb
13	captured by the licensed health care practitioner through a cast, digital
14	appliance, measurement, mold, pressure sensitive device, or scanning device
15	if the patient has first presented to the licensed health care practitioner a
16	written order for the prefabricated device from a health care practitioner
17	authorized by law to write the order.
18	
19	17-107-105. Criminal penalty.
20	(a)(1) It is a Class C misdemeanor for any individual to:
21	(A) Practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics in this
22	state unless he or she is licensed under this chapter;
23	(B) Hold himself or herself out as being able to practice
24	orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics in this state;
25	(C) Dispense an orthosis, a prosthesis, or a pedorthic
26	device unless he or she is licensed under this chapter;
27	(D) Represent himself or herself to the public by title or
28	description of services that includes any of the following terms unless he or
29	she is licensed under this chapter:
30	(i) "Orthotic", "orthotist", "brace", or a similar
31	title or description of services;
32	(ii) "Pedorthic", "pedorthist", or a similar title
33	or description of services; or
34	(iii) "Prosthetic", "prosthetist", "artificial
35	limb", or a similar title or description of services;
36	(E) Practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics during

1	the time his or her license is suspended; or
2	(F) Otherwise violate any provisions of this chapter or
3	rules promulgated under this chapter.
4	(2) Each day an offense under this section continues is a
5	separate offense.
6	(b) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing
7	Board and the Department of Health and Human Services shall assist the
8	prosecuting attorney in the enforcement of this chapter.
9	
10	17-107-106. Civil penalty and injunction.
11	(a)(1) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing
12	Board may levy a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000)
13	for each violation of this chapter or rules promulgated under this chapter
14	against any individual found by the board to be in violation of this chapter
15	or rules promulgated under this chapter.
16	(2) Each day a violation continues is a separate offense.
17	(3) Unless the civil penalty imposed under this section is paid
18	within fifteen (15) calendar days following the date for an appeal from the
19	order, the board may file suit in the Pulaski County Circuit Court to obtain
20	a judgment for the amount of the unpaid civil penalty.
21	(4)(A) The imposition of a civil penalty under this section does
22	not relieve an individual from criminal prosecution under this chapter or
23	from the imposition of an injunction under this section.
24	(B) The remedy of a civil penalty under this section is
25	additional to any other penalties that may be imposed by the board or by a
26	circuit court under this chapter.
27	(b)(1) The board may petition any circuit court having jurisdiction
28	over an individual who is practicing without a license as required by this
29	chapter, an individual to whom a license has been denied, or an individual
30	$\underline{\text{whose license has been suspended or revoked by action of the board under this}}$
31	chapter to enjoin the individual from continuing to practice within this
32	state.
33	(2)(A) The issuance of an injunction under this section shall
34	$\underline{\text{not relieve an individual from criminal prosecution under this chapter or } \\ \underline{\text{the}}$
35	imposition of civil penalties under this section.
36	(B) The remedy of an injunction under this section is

1 additional to any other penalties that may be imposed by the board or by a 2 circuit court under this chapter. 3 4 Subchapter 2. Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing 5 Board. 6 17-107-201. Board -- Creation. 7 (a) There is created the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and 8 Pedorthics Licensing Board consisting of seven (7) members as follows: 9 (1)(A) Five (5) individuals, each of whom is eligible for 10 licensure as an orthotist, prosthetist, or pedorthist. 11 (B) One (1) of the five (5) individuals appointed under 12 subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section may be a retired orthotist, 13 prosthetist, or pedorthist; 14 (2) One (1) member who is a representative of the Division of 15 Medical Services of the Department of Health and Human Services; and 16 (3) One (1) member who is a representative of the public at 17 large. 18 (b) The Governor shall appoint the members subject to confirmation by 19 the Senate. 20 (c)(l) Each initial member who is eligible for licensure as an orthotist, a prosthetist, or a pedorthist shall be selected from a list of 21 22 fifteen (15) candidates who have practiced orthotics, prosthetics, or 23 pedorthics for at least three (3) years. The Arkansas Orthotic Prosthetic 24 Association shall submit the list of candidates to the Governor no later than 25 July 1, 2007. 26 (2)(A) Each successor member shall be selected from a list of 27 three (3) individuals per position submitted to the Governor by the board. 28 (B) Each successor member shall have practiced orthotics, 29 prosthetics, or pedorthics for at least three (3) years preceding his or her 30 appointment and shall be licensed under this chapter as an orthotist, a prosthetist, or a pedorthist. 31 32 (d)(1) The Governor shall designate the terms of the initial 33 appointees so that three (3) members shall serve three-year terms, two (2) 34 members shall serve two-year terms, and two (2) members shall serve one-year 35 terms. 36 (2)(A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(2)(A)(ii) of

1	this section, each successor member shall serve three-year terms.
2	(ii) An individual appointed to fill a vacancy
3	resulting in an unexpired term shall only serve for the remainder of the
4	unexpired term.
5	(B) The Governor shall fill any vacancy on the board in
6	the same manner as other appointments.
7	(3)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(3)(B) of this
8	section, no member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.
9	(B) The member who is a representative of the Division of
10	Medical Services of the Department of Health and Human Services may succeed
11	himself or herself.
12	(e) Upon recommendation of the board made after notice and hearing,
13	the Governor may remove any member for incompetence, neglect of duty, or
14	malfeasance in office.
15	
16	17-107-202. Organization and proceedings.
17	(a)(1) Within thirty (30) days after the initial appointment of the
18	members of the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing
19	Board, the Governor shall call the first meeting of the board for the purpose
20	of organization.
21	(2) The board shall elect a chair and vice chair at its first
22	regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year.
23	(3) The board shall meet as frequently as it deems necessary, at
24	such times and places as the board designates. Additional meetings may be
25	held upon call of the chair or upon written request of four (4) members.
26	(b) A quorum of the board shall consist of four (4) members.
27	(c) The members of the board shall serve without compensation but may
28	receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq.
29	However, the expenses shall in no case exceed funds available to the board $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$
30	(d) All proceedings of the board shall be conducted in accordance with
31	the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.
32	(e) The Division of Medical Services of the Department of Health and
33	Human Services shall provide staff support for the board.
34	
35	17-107-203. Power to issue subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum.
36	(a) In connection with its investigations and hearings, the Arkansas

1	Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board may:
2	(1) Issue a subpoena to require any individual who has
3	information germane to an investigation or hearing conducted by the board to
4	testify before the board; and
5	(2) Issue a subpoena duces tecum to require to be transmitted to
6	the board any book, writing, document, or other paper or thing which is
7	germane to an investigation or hearing conducted by the board.
8	(b)(1) Service of a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum shall be as
9	provided by law for the service of a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum in a
10	civil case in a circuit court of this state. The fees and mileage of an
11	officer serving a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum and a witness appearing
12	in answer to a subpoena shall be the same as provided by law for a proceeding
13	in a civil case in a circuit court of this state.
14	(2)(A) The board shall issue a subpoena or a subpoena duces
15	tecum upon the request of any party to a hearing before the board.
16	(B) The fees and mileage of an officer serving a subpoena
17	or a subpoena duces tecum and a witness appearing in answer to a subpoena
18	shall be paid by the party at whose request the witness is subpoenaed.
19	(c)(1) If an individual has been served with a subpoena or a subpoena
20	duces tecum as provided in this section and fails to comply with the subpoena
21	or the subpoena duces tecum, the board may apply to the circuit court of the
22	county in which the board is conducting its investigation or hearing for an
23	order causing the arrest of the individual and directing that the individual
24	be brought before the court.
25	(2) The circuit court may punish the disobedient individual for
26	contempt as provided by law for a proceeding of a civil case in a circuit
27	court of this state.
28	
29	17-107-204. Powers and duties.
30	(a) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing
31	Board shall adopt rules prescribing all of the following:
32	(1) Procedures for the issuance, renewal, inactivation,
33	restoration, suspension, and revocation of a license or certification;
34	(2) Standards and procedures for formulating, evaluating,
35	approving, and administering licensing examinations or recognizing other
36	entities that conduct examinations;

1	(3) Procedures for the conduct of a disciplinary hearing;
2	(4) Standards of ethical and professional conduct in the
3	practice of orthotics, prosthetics, and pedorthics;
4	(5) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval
5	of national certification organizations in orthotics, prosthetics, and
6	pedorthics;
7	(6) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval
8	of educational programs required for licensure, including standards for
9	foreign educational credentials;
10	(7) Standards for approving, denying, and withdrawing approval
11	of continuing education programs required for license renewal;
12	(8) Standards for regulating advertising by individuals licensed
13	under this chapter;
14	(9) Fees and penalties for services relating to examination,
15	licensing, endorsement, temporary permits, license renewal, and other
16	services reasonably related to the practice of orthotics, prosthetics, or
17	pedorthics as determined by the board; and
18	(10) Civil money penalties for violations of this chapter.
19	(b) The board may adopt other rules that are reasonably related to the
20	safe and competent performance of prosthetics, orthotics, and pedorthics and
21	necessary for the administration of this chapter.
22	
23	17-107-205. Deposit of funds.
24	All funds received by the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and
25	Pedorthics Licensing Board shall be deposited into the State Treasury to the
26	credit of the board.
27	
28	Subchapter 3. Licensing.
29	17-107-301. Orthotists.
30	(a) An applicant for a license to practice orthotics shall submit to
31	the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board written
32	evidence verified by oath that the applicant:
33	(1) Possesses a baccalaureate degree or has completed semester
34	hours equivalent to four (4) years of study at a four-year college or
35	university;
36	(2) Has completed an orthotic education program:

1	(3) has completed a clinical residency in orthotics;
2	(4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly
3	accepted standards of orthotic care; and
4	(5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board
5	that are reasonably related to the practice of orthotics.
6	(b) The board may issue a license to practice orthotics to an
7	applicant:
8	(1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination
9	approved by the board; or
10	(2) By endorsement, if the applicant has been licensed as an
11	orthotist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country and
12	meets the qualifications required of orthotists in this state.
13	
14	17-107-302. Pedorthists.
15	(a) An applicant for a license to practice pedorthics shall submit to
16	the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board written
17	evidence verified by oath that the applicant:
18	(1) Possesses a high school diploma or comparable credential
19	approved by the board;
20	(2) Has completed a pedorthic education program;
21	(3) Has completed a qualified work experience program or
22	internship in pedorthics;
23	(4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly
24	accepted standards of pedorthic care acceptable to the board; and
25	(5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board
26	that are reasonably related to the practice of pedorthics.
27	(b) The board may issue a license to practice pedorthics:
28	(1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination
29	approved by the board; or
30	(2) By endorsement, if an applicant has been licensed as a
31	pedorthist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country and
32	meets the qualifications required of pedorthists in this state.
33	
34	17-107-303. Prosthetists.
35	(a) An applicant for a license to practice prosthetics shall submit to
36	the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board written

1	evidence verified by oath that the applicant:
2	(1) Possesses a baccalaureate degree or has completed semester
3	hours equivalent to four (4) years of study at a four-year college or
4	university;
5	(2) Has completed a prosthetic education program;
6	(3) Has completed a clinical residency in prosthetics;
7	(4) Is qualified to practice in accordance with commonly
8	accepted standards of prosthetic care; and
9	(5) Satisfies any other requirements established by the board
10	that are reasonably related to the practice of prosthetics.
11	(b) The board may issue a license to practice prosthetics to an
12	applicant:
13	(1) By examination, if the applicant passes an examination
14	approved by the board; or
15	(2) By endorsement, if the applicant has been licensed as a
16	prosthetist under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign country
17	and meets the qualifications required of prosthetists in this state.
18	
19	
20	
21	17-107-304. Orthotic assistants, prosthetic assistants,
22	orthotic/prosthetic assistants.
23	An applicant for certification to practice as an orthotic assistant, ar
24	orthotic/prosthetic assistant, or a prosthetic assistant shall submit to the
25	Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board written
26	evidence verified by oath that the applicant:
27	(1) Possesses a high school diploma or comparable credential
28	approved by the board;
29	(2) Has a minimum of five (5) years of experience in the field
30	in which the individual is seeking licensure as an assistant; and
31	(3) Has written documentation from a licensed prosthetist or a
32	licensed orthotist that the applicant is qualified to perform as an assistant
33	in the field in which the individual is seeking licensure as an assistant.
34	
35	17-107-305. Temporary permits.
36	(a)(1) The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing

_	board may issue a temporary permit to practice orthodics, prostnetics, or
2	pedorthics to a qualified applicant who has:
3	(A) Satisfactorily completed an approved education program
4	in the field in which the individual is seeking licensure; and
5	(B) Applied for or is awaiting results of the first
6	examination he or she is eligible to take after the permit is issued.
7	(2) The temporary permit to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or
8	pedorthics becomes invalid upon notification to the applicant of the results
9	of the first examination he or she is eligible to take after the permit is
10	issued.
11	(b)(1) The board may issue a temporary permit to practice orthotics,
12	prosthetics, or pedorthics to a qualified applicant awaiting endorsement and
13	holding a current license to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics
14	or the equivalent from another jurisdiction, state, or territory.
15	(2) The temporary permit to practice orthotics, prosthetics, or
16	pedorthics shall:
17	(A) Specify the date it was issued and its expiration date;
18	<u>and</u>
19	(B) Not be valid for more than six (6) months.
20

22	(a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter shall renew
23	his or her license or certification with the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics,
24	and Pedorthics Licensing Board in accordance with this section and procedures
25	established by the board.
26	(b)(1) At least sixty (60) days prior to the renewal date of a
27	individual's license or certification under this chapter, the board shall:
28	(A) Mail to the individual a renewal application for his
29	or her license or certification; and
30	(B) Notify the individual of the renewal date of his or
31	her license or certification.
32	(2) The board shall mail the renewal application to the most
33	recent address of the individual as the address appears in the records of the
34	board.
35	(3) The individual shall complete the renewal application and
36	return it to the hoard with the required renewal fee by the renewal date of

24	the renewal application is accurate; and
25	(2) The renewal fee plus a penalty is paid by a date specified

28	17-107-307. License Display.
29	(a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter shall:
30	(1) Keep his or her license prominently displayed in his or her
31	office or in a place in which he or she practices; or
32	(2) Store his or her license in a place from which the license
33	can be immediately produced upon request of a patient or a representative of
34	the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board.
35	
36	17-107-308. License Replacement.

1	(a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter whose
2	license has been lost or destroyed may apply to the Arkansas Orthotics,
3	Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board for a replacement. The
4	application shall be accompanied by an affidavit setting out the facts
5	concerning the loss or destruction of the original license.
6	(b) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter whose name
7	is changed by marriage or court order may surrender his or her license and
8	apply to the board for a replacement license.
9	
10	17-107-309. License Inactive status.
11	(a) An individual licensed or certified under this chapter may place
12	his or her license or certification on inactive status by notifying the
13	Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board in writing.
14	(b)(1) The holder of an inactive license or certification is excused
15	from payment of renewal fees and shall not practice in his or her area of
16	licensure or certification in this state.
17	(2) Any individual who engages in the practice of orthotics,
18	pedorthics, or prosthetics or serves as an orthotic assistant,
19	orthotic/prosthetic assistant, or prosthetic assistant while his or her
20	<u>license</u> or certification under this chapter is inactive is considered to be
21	practicing without a license or certification. Practicing without a license
22	or certification is grounds for discipline under § 17-107-310.
23	(c) The board may restore an inactive license or certification under
24	this chapter if:
25	(1) The holder of the inactive license or certification:
26	(A) Successfully completes the continuing education
27	requirements established by the board; and
28	(B) Complies with rules established by the board; and
29	(2) The current renewal fee is paid by a date specified by the
30	board.

32	17-107-310. Disciplinary action.
33	The Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board may
34	deny, suspend, revoke, or restrict any license or certification issued under
35	this chapter or otherwise discipline an individual licensed or certified
36	under this chapter upon proof that the individual:

1	(1) Has plead guilty or nolo contendere to or has been found
2	guilty of a felony;
3	(2) Has used intoxicating liquors, narcotics, controlled
4	substances, or other drugs in a manner that adversely affects the license or
5	certificate holder's ability to practice;
6	(3) Has become physically or mentally incompetent to practice to
7	the extent that the license or certificate holder's professional competence
8	is impaired and the public is endangered;
9	(4) Has committed fraud or deceit in the procuring or attempting
10	to procure a license or certification under this chapter;
11	(5) Has aided or abetted an unlicensed or uncertified individual
12	to perform the duties of a license or certificate holder under this chapter;
13	(6) Has engaged in any practice beyond the scope of duties
14	permitted a license or certificate holder under this chapter;
15	(7) Is incompetent or grossly negligent in his or her
16	performance as a license or certification holder;
17	(8) Has engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct;
18	(9) Has advertised in a false, fraudulent, deceptive, or
19	misleading manner;
20	(10) Has knowingly betrayed a professional secret;
21	(11) Has violated a regulation of the board;
22	(12) Has violated a term of probation or an order previously
23	imposed by the board; or
24	(13) Has had a license, certificate, or registration revoked or
25	suspended or has been placed on probation or under disciplinary order in any
26	jurisdiction.

29	(a)(1) Until December 31, 2007, the Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics,
30	and Pedorthics Licensing Board may issue a license to practice orthotics
31	under this chapter to:
32	(A) An individual who makes application for licensure as
33	an orthotist, pays the required licensure fee, and submits evidence of
34	certification from one (1) of the following:
35	(i) The American Board for Certification in
36	Orthotics and Prosthetics, Inc., as a Certified Orthotist or Certified

1	<pre>Orthotist/Prosthetist;</pre>
2	(ii) The Board for Orthotist/Prosthetist
3	Certification as a BOC - Orthotist; or
4	(iii) Any other accrediting body with equivalent
5	educational requirements and examination standards that is approved by the
6	Arkansas Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics Licensing Board; and
7	(B)(i) An individual who makes application for licensure,
8	pays the required licensure fee, and submits evidence satisfactory to the
9	board of a full-time practice in orthotics for a minimum of five (5) of the
10	seven (7) years immediately prior to the date of application.
11	(ii) Licensure under this subdivision (a)(1) may
