3	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the		
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that surviving spouses of		
5	firefighters killed while on duty lose retirement benefits upon any		
6	remarriage and should be able to have retirement benefits restored, upon		
7	application to their fund's board of trustees, and also be eligible for		
8	benefit increases granted during the interim between their benefit		
9	termination and restoration, subject to the board of trustees' discretion;		
10	and that this act is immediately necessary for the protection of these		
11	surviving spouses of firefighters. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
12	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
13	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
14	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
15	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
16	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
17	<pre>bill; or</pre>		
18	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
19	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
