NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 9 10 DIRECTOR'S OFFICE OF CHIEF COUNSEL - PURCHASE OF EVIDENCE. 11 approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Chief Counsel for the Department of Health and Human Services may transfer an amount up to but not 12 to exceed \$12,000 for the $\frac{2005-2007}{2007-2009}$ biennial period and deposit 13 14 same in a bank account for the purpose of purchasing evidence in the course 15 of investigating the illegal use of food stamps/Electronic Benefit Transfer 16 (EBT) cards. SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA SALARIES. There is hereby authorized for the Department of Health and Human Services for the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennium the following increases in salaries for certain positions provided in the regular salary schedule of the Department of Health and Human Services and to be in addition to the annual amounts as established by the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, as amended: for full-time physicians certified by the American Specialty Boards, a rate of pay not to exceed an additional \$4,500 per year; for each full-time physician eligible to be certified by the American Specialty Boards, a rate of pay not to exceed \$2,500 per year. If a physician is certified in Child Psychiatry, an additional \$2,500 per year will be allowed with the total not

to exceed \$7,000. If a physician is certified in Forensic Psychiatry, an

- 1 additional \$2,500 per year will be allowed with the total not to exceed

- 10 SERVICES RENOVATION FUND. Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.
- 11 (a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor of
- 12 State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
- 13 Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.
- 14 (b) This fund shall be used for constructing, acquiring, renovating,
- 15 maintaining, repairing, and equipping facilities of the Department of Health
- 16 and Human Services and for paying disallowances by the federal government.
- 17 (c) The fund shall consist of:
- 18 (1) Federal reimbursement received by the Department of Health and Human
- 19 Services and deposited in the various fund accounts of the department; and
- 20 (2) General revenues transferred from the Division of Youth Services, the
- 21 Division of Behavioral Health, and the Division of Developmental Disabilities
- 22 Services, and the Division of Health for the purposes of repairing,
- 23 renovating, equipping, acquiring and constructing Department of Health and
- 24 Human Services facilities with an annual maximum of five million dollars
- 25 (\$5,000,000). The projects for which these transfers are authorized must be
- 26 projects which were unanticipated during the preceding regular session of the
- 27 Arkansas General Assembly and must be projects which, if not carried out in
- 28 the interim period between regular sessions of the Arkansas General Assembly
- 29 would cause greater harm to the facilities, clients or programs of the
- 30 Department of Health and Human Services than to wait until the next regular
- 31 session.
- 32 (3) Other non-general revenue funds as may be available within the
- 33 Department of Health and Human Services that can be used for the purposes of
- 34 this fund.
- 35 (d)(1) At the request of the Director of the Department of <u>Health and</u> Human
- 36 Services, and upon certification of the availability of such funds, the Chief

- 1 Fiscal Officer of the State shall initiate the necessary transfer documents
- 2 to reflect the transfer on the books of record of the Treasurer of State, the
- 3 Auditor of State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the Department

The Director of the 2 Department of Health and Human Services is authorized to request fund transfers according to the provisions established by Arkansas Code Ann. 19-5-3 4 1020, Department of Human Services Renovation Fund, as amended herein; and 5 (b) MATCH TRANSFER. The Director of the Department of Health and Human 6 Services, with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, is 7 authorized to effect inter-agency and inter-divisional fund transfers for the 8 purpose of providing the State's matching share for payments made to that 9 Division or Office or its service providers for services eligible for federal 10 reimbursement under programs administered by the Department of Health and 11 Human Services. The Department of Health and Human Services shall report to 12 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee on a quarterly basis all 13 fund transfers made in accordance with the authority granted by this section; 14 and 15 (c) YOUTH SERVICES - HOUSING AND SEPARATION APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS. 16 Division of Youth Services (DYS) is authorized to fulfill its responsibility 17 to house offenders between the ages of 18 and 21 and to separate juvenile offenders by age and seriousness of offense by either employing additional 18 19 state employees and providing the corresponding operating expenses or entering into professional services contracts. If the Division of Youth 20 21 Services determines that the Division needs to employ state employees to 22 fulfill the housing and separation requirements, they may transfer up to the 23 total amount appropriated for the DYS - Residential Services Program 24 appropriation to the appropriate DYS appropriation and line items, upon 25 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and prior review by the 26 Legislative Council; and 27 (d) REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES: (1) The Department of Health and Human 28 Services (DHHS) provides hundreds of different services to over 1 million Arkansans. The specific mix of service needs and the funding and staffing 29 30 required to provide them can vary significantly based on many factors, including natural disasters, changing federal mandates and funding sources, 31 32 demographic shifts, fluctuating court-ordered services, social trends, and 33 job market variations such as nursing shortages. The impact of these factors 34 through the course of a biennium make it very difficult for the Department to accurately predict the exact needs for funding, appropriation and positions 35 in each of its over 100 different appropriations. To ensure that it can 36

1 respond quickly to changing client needs and make the most effective use of 2 the resources allocated to it, the Department of Health and Human Services shall be authorized to utilize the reallocation of resource authority to make 3 4 the proper adjustments to the budgets within the Department. Therefore, upon 5 Upon determination by the Director of the Department of Health and Human 6 Services that a reallocation of resources within the department is necessary 7 for the efficient and effective operation of the department, the director, 8 with approval of the Governor, shall have the authority to request, from the 9 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a transfer of positions, appropriations, 10 line item appropriations, and funds within or between existing and newly 11 created divisions, offices, sections, or units of the department. Provided, 12 however, that no transfer of funds or appropriation that provides direct 13 support or matching support for the Arkansas Medicaid Program shall be made 14 to any other fund account or appropriation that does not directly support the 15 Arkansas Medicaid Program. Further, no positions, funds, or appropriation 16 authorized during the 2005-2007 2007-2009 biennial budget process for the 17 Division of Children and Family Services compliance with initiatives established under the Angela R. consent decree shall be transferred to any 18 19 other division. Nothing in this provision is intended to prevent the one-20 time transfers of savings in any other program to the Arkansas Medicaid 21 Program, with the exception of the provisions previously cited for the 22 Division of Children and Family Services - Angela R. consent decree. The 23 Division of Developmental Disabilities - Grants to Community Providers line 24 item of the Developmental Disabilities Services - Grants-in-Aid appropriation 25 may not be decreased. The appropriation, funding, and positions provided for 26 the six Human Development Centers shall remain at a level sufficient to 27 ensure quality care for the Centers' residents. If requested by the Division 28 of Child Care and Early Childhood Education (DCCECE), the Division of County 29 Operations shall transfer sufficient general revenue to allow the State to 30 access the full allocation of Federal Funds available through the Matching 31 Category of the Child Care Development Fund. General Revenue Dollars 32 transferred to DCCECE must be used as matching funds to support the 33 Transitional Employment Assistance (TEA) Program and must be eligible to be counted toward the State's Maintenance-of-Effort requirement for the 34 35 Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Block Grant. The exemptions 36 provided in this subsection whereby certain—DHS DHHS Programs and Divisions

- 1 are protected from appropriation, fund, or position transfers are applicable
- 2 only to the reallocation or transfer authority granted herein, and not by any

- 28 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
- 29 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
- 30 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
- 31 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
- 32 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
- 33 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
- 34 has determined that the Department of Health and Human Services may operate
- 35 more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Health
- 36 and Human Services authorizing broad powers under the Reallocation of

- 27 appropriated in each division Act. This program is for eligible nursing
- 28 students who are attending accredited nursing institutions to become
- 29 Registered or Licensed Practical Nurses, as well as Certified Nursing
- 30 Assistants, Life Skills Trainers and Mental Health Workers.

- 32 The stipend is \$5,000 per person per year. Any student who is awarded and
- 33 accepts a stipend is under employment commitment to the respective DHHS
- 34 Division and is required to work for that division, in a full-time employee
- 35 status effective immediately upon graduation. The student employment
- 36 commitment is equal to the number of years the stipend was awarded and

1 accepted. In the event of Employee/Student default of the employment 2 commitment, the Employee/Student will be considered in breach of contract and 3 repayment of the stipend will be required as specified in the Stipend 4 Contract. 5 6 Each division participating in the Education Stipend Program shall determine 7 on an annual basis, the number of student stipends available. 8 9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2007 10 through June 30, 2009. 11 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HAZARDOUS DUTY PAY. The Department of Health and Human Services is hereby authorized to 14 15 pay hazardous duty pay to eligible personnel to compensate for the increased 16 risk of personal injury. The hazardous duty pay authorized herein shall not 17 exceed an amount equal to 5 and one-half percent (5.5%) of the annual salary 18 authorized by law to any eligible employee and shall only be made available 19 to the personnel occupying high risk positions in special treatment units as 20 described in this section. 21 22 In cases of documented need, the Director of Health and Human Services shall 23 identify the facility and/or unit, location and eligible classifications 24 within the facility or unit. Such positions shall be certified by the DHHS 25 Director as having been assigned to a work environment that poses an 26 increased risk of personal injury and shall be submitted to the Office of 27 Personnel Management for approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State 28 after review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council. Subsequent changes to the facility and/or unit, location and eligible classifications 29 30 within the facility or unit on file with the OPM must receive prior approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State after review and approval by the 31 32 Arkansas Legislative Council.

The amounts received under this provision shall not be considered as

exceeding the maximum authorized annual salary rate of the assigned grade.

In no event shall the 12 Department of Health and Human Services, or any of its governing boards, 13 sell, lease, rent, convey or encumber the land and facilities of Ray Winder 14 Field in Little Rock, Arkansas without the prior review and approval of the 15 16 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 17 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NURSING/ DIRECT CARE RECRUITMENT/ RETENTION BONUSES. Special provision to provide 20 Nursing/Direct Care Recruitment and Retention Bonuses for the Department of 21 22 Health and Human Services is hereby authorized to pay from State and Federal 23 funds appropriated for each respective division. Nursing/direct care service 24 recruitment/retention bonuses are in addition to the maximum annual amounts 25 provided in the Regular Salaries Section of the respective Division Act for 26 Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Certified Nursing Assistant, Life Skills Trainer and Mental Health Worker. New hire nurses must be licensed by 27 the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. The total recruitment/retention bonus 28 29 payment commitment for eligible nurses shall not exceed \$4,000 per Registered 30 Nurse and \$2,000 per Licensed Practical Nurse and \$1,000 per Certified Nursing Assistant, Life Skil<u>ls Trainer and Mental Health Worker. The lump</u> 31 32 sum bonus payments and employment commitment to the State will be made in 33 partial payments as follows: 34 Registered Nurse Classifications 35 36 \$1,000 after completing 6 months probationary employment

11	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
