(b) Any relief granted by the circuit court for protection under the provisions of this chapter shall be for a fixed period of time not less than ninety (90) days nor more than $\frac{1}{100}$ ten (10) years in duration, in the discretion of the circuit court, and may be renewed at a subsequent hearing upon proof and a finding by the circuit court that the threat of domestic abuse still exists.
